## Ordinance of the States **XXXIII**

### **The Pharmacists, Poisons and Pharmacy (Amendment) Ordinance, 1971**

THE STATES, on the representations of the States Board of Health, hereby order:—

1. The Pharmacists, Poisons and Pharmacy Ordinance, 1970 (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Ordinance”)(a), is hereby amended as follows:— Amendments to Ordinance of 1970.

(a) in section fifteen thereof—

(i) paragraph (b) of subsection (4) thereof is repealed and the following paragraph is substituted therefor—

“(b) a sheep dip or sheep wash in a container clearly labelled with a notice of the special purpose for which the substance is intended and a warning that it is only to be used for that purpose, such labelling being additional to any labelling required under the provisions of this Ordinance.”;

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(a) Ordinance No. VI of 1970.

(ii) immediately after subsection (8) thereof there is inserted the following additional subsection numbered (8A)—

“ (8A) A person shall not sell or supply zinc phosphide:

Provided that this subsection shall not apply to the sale or supply of zinc phosphide—

- (i) to a person or institution concerned with scientific education or research or chemical analysis, for the purposes of that education or research or analysis;
  - (ii) subject to the provisions of paragraph (c) of subsection (2) of this section, to an authorised employee of the States for use as a rodenticide;
  - (iii) subject to the provisions of paragraph (d) of subsection (2) of this section, to a person, or to the employee of a body of persons, carrying on a business of pest control, for use as a rodenticide for the purposes of such business.”;
- (b) in section forty-two thereof, in the definition of the expression “antimonial poisons” the words “oxides of antimony, sulphides of antimony,” are repealed;
- (c) in the First Schedule thereto the following items are inserted at the appropriate points therein in alphabetical order:—

“Bezitramide; its salts”

“Dihydrocodeinone O-carboxymethyloxime; its salts; its esters; their salts”;

(d) in Group II of the Third Schedule thereto—

(i) in the second column thereof the entry relating to the item “Nicotine” is deleted and the entry—

“Tobacco; preparations in aerosol dispensers containing not more than 0.2 per cent. of nicotine, weight in weight; other liquid preparations, and solid preparations with a soap base, containing not more than 7.5 per cent. of nicotine, weight in weight”

is substituted therefor;

(ii) in the second column thereof in the entry relating to the item “Arsenical poisons” a semi-colon is inserted at the end of the entry and immediately thereafter the words “animal feeding stuffs containing not more than 0.01 per cent. of arsenilic acid and not containing any other arsenical poison” are inserted;

(iii) in the second column thereof in the entry relating to the item “Hydrocyanic acid” a semi-colon is inserted at the end of the entry and immediately thereafter the words “in reagent kits supplied for medical or veterinary purposes, substances containing less than the equivalent of 0.1 per cent., weight in weight, of hydrocyanic acid (HCN)” are inserted;

- (iv) in the first column thereof the words "Paraquat, salts of" are deleted and the word "Paraquat" is substituted therefor;
- (v) in the second column thereof in the entry relating to the item "Phenols" the following items are inserted at the appropriate points therein in alphabetical order:—  
 "Butylated hydroxytoluene;"  
 "in reagent kits supplied for medical or veterinary purposes;"
- (vi) in the first column thereof all the items beginning with the item "Phosphamidon" to and including the item "Vamidothion", under the heading beginning with the words "Phosphorous compounds" and the entry opposite thereto in the second column thereof are deleted and the items set out in the first column of the Schedule to this Ordinance and the entries set out opposite thereto in the second column thereof are respectively substituted therefor;
- (vii) in the second column thereof the entry relating to the item "Potassium hydroxide" is deleted and the entry—  
 "Substances containing the equivalent of less than seventeen per cent. of total caustic alkalinity expressed as potassium hydroxide; accumulators; batteries"  
 is substituted therefor;
- (viii) in the first column thereof at the appropriate point therein in alphabetical order the item "Quinine; its

salts" is inserted and immediately opposite thereto in the second column thereof the entry—

"Preparations containing not more than one per cent. of quinine or its salts; soft drinks, wines or tonic wines; preparations containing not more than fifteen per cent. of quinine or its salts for use in the manufacture of soft drinks, wines, tonic wines or confectionery"

is inserted;

(ix) in the second column thereof the entry relating to the item "Sodium hydroxide" is deleted and the entry—

"Substances containing the equivalent of less than twelve per cent. of total caustic alkalinity expressed as sodium hydroxide"

is substituted therefor;

(x) in the first column thereof the words "Sodium nitrate" are deleted and the words "Sodium nitrite" are substituted therefor;

(e) in Part B of the Fourth Schedule thereto the following items are inserted at the appropriate points therein in alphabetical order:—

"Dothiepin; its salts"

"Isoaminile; its salts"

"Quinine; its salts; except in preparations containing less than ten per cent. of quinine or its salts"

"Salbutamol; its salts";

(f) in the Fifth Schedule thereto—

(i) in Part A thereof the item “Calcium arsenates”, under the heading “Arsenical substances” and the entry opposite thereto in the second column thereof are deleted;

(ii) in Part B thereof, in the item beginning with the words “Arsenical poisons”, the words “calcium arsenates” are deleted;

(g) in the Seventh Schedule thereto all the words beginning with the words “The proportion of antimony” to and including the words “as the case may be.” in the first column thereof and the words “Antimonial poisons” opposite thereto in the second column thereof are deleted and the words “Antimonial poisons” and the entry—

“The proportion of antimony trioxide ( $\text{Sb}_2\text{O}_3$ ) or antimony pentoxide ( $\text{Sb}_2\text{O}_5$ ) that the preparation would be calculated to contain on the assumption that the antimony (Sb) in the poison had been wholly converted into antimony trioxide or antimony pentoxide, as the case may be.”

are respectively substituted therefor;

(h) in the Tenth Schedule thereto—

(i) in Part I thereof—

(a) the following items are inserted at the appropriate points therein in alphabetical order:—

“Beziramide; its salts”

“Dihydrocodeinone O-carboxymethyloxime; its salts; its esters; their salts”

“3-(3,4-Dihydroxyphenyl)alanine;  
its salts”

“Dothiepin; its salts”

“Quinine; its salts”

“Salbutamol; its salts”;

(b) in the item beginning with the word “Antimony” the words “oxides of antimony; sulphides of antimony;” are deleted;

(c) in the item beginning with the word “alpha-Methylphenethylamine” the words “ephedrine and its optical isomers,” are deleted and the words “ephedrine, its optical isomers and” are substituted therefor;

(ii) in Part II thereof—

(a) the item “Calcium arsenates”, under the heading “Arsenical substances”, is deleted;

(b) in the item beginning with the words “Hydrofluoric acid” immediately after the semi-colon following those words, the words “alkali metal bifluorides; ammonium bifluoride;” are inserted;

(i) in the Thirteenth Schedule thereto the words “or fluoroacetanilide”, wherever those words occur, are deleted and the words “; fluoroacetanilide or zinc phosphide” are substituted therefor.

2. This Ordinance shall have effect in the Islands Extent.

- Citation. 3. This Ordinance may be cited as the Pharmacists, Poisons and Pharmacy (Amendment) Ordinance, 1971.
- Collective title. 4. This Ordinance and the principal Ordinance may be cited together as the Pharmacists, Poisons and Pharmacy Ordinances, 1970 and 1971.
