**The Plants and Potatoes Importation
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1953.**

THE STATES, on the representations of the States Committee for Agriculture and Fisheries, hereby order—

1. The Plants and Potatoes Importation Ordinance, 1951 (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Ordinance”) is hereby amended as follows—

- (a) in paragraph (iii) of section 1 of the principal Ordinance immediately after the word “(Poplar)” there are hereby inserted the words “or the genus *Quercus* (Oak) or the genus *Ulmus* (Elm)”;
- (b) in section 2 of the principal Ordinance all the words from the word “Notwithstanding” to the word “Bailiwick” where that word secondly occurs are hereby repealed and the following words substituted therefor:—

“Notwithstanding any of the provisions of sections 1 and 4 hereof, there shall be no restriction on the landing or transhipment in this Island—

- (i) of plants landed or grown in and shipped directly to this Island from the United Kingdom, the Republic

of Ireland, the Isle of Man, the Island of Jersey or another Island of this Bailiwick and, in the case of all species of the genus *Ulmus* (Elm), from the places aforesaid and from the Continent of Europe, or

- (ii) of potatoes grown in and shipped directly to this Island from one of the other Islands of this Bailiwick : ”;
- (c) in the first proviso to section 2 of the principal Ordinance the words “ published in La Gazette Officielle ” are hereby repealed and the comma immediately following the said words is hereby deleted;
- (d) in section 6 of the principal Ordinance immediately after the word “ potatoes ” there are hereby inserted the words “ and may at any time vary such terms and conditions or revoke or vary such permission ”;
- (e) in subsection (1) of section 8 of the principal Ordinance immediately after the word “ Ordinance ” there are hereby inserted the words “ or of any order made thereunder or who, having been granted permission under the provisions of section 6 thereof infringes any conditions attached to that permission, ”;
- (f) in paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section 8 immediately after the word “ Ordinance ” there are hereby inserted the words “ or any order made thereunder or permission granted under the provisions of section 6 thereof ”.

2. This Ordinance and the principal Ordinance may be cited together as the Plants and Potatoes Importation Ordinances, 1951 and 1953.
