Ordinance of the States **XXVI**

The Prohibited Places (Dogs) Ordinance, 1970

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the thirtieth day of April, nineteen hundred and seventy, hereby order:—

1. (1) The owner of a dog shall not permit that dog to be on any of the streets or roads, including the footpaths adjacent to such streets or roads, quays, jetties or walks set out in the Schedule to this Ordinance (hereinafter referred to as “the prohibited places”) otherwise than in his charge or in charge of another person.

Prohibition on dogs straying or fouling certain places.

(2) A person being in charge of a dog on any of the prohibited places shall at all times keep that dog on a lead.

(3) A person being in charge of a dog shall not permit that dog to foul any of the prohibited places by depositing its excrement thereon or urinating thereon.

(4) In this section the expression "owner" means the person whose name is on the collar of the dog, or on a metal disc attached to the collar of the dog, as the case may be, in accordance with the provisions of the Dog Licences (Guernsey) Law, 1969(a).

Penalty

2. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of the last preceding section shall be guilty of an offence and liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding ten pounds.

Repeal.

3. The Prohibited Places (Dogs) Ordinance, 1967(b), is hereby repealed.

Citation.

4. This Ordinance may be cited as the Prohibited Places (Dogs) Ordinance, 1970.

SCHEDULE

Section one

1. High Street, Church Square, Market Hill, Commercial Arcade, Market Street, Mill Street, Mansell Street, Contrée Mansell, Mansell Court, the Bordage, Fountain Street, Smith Street, Pollet Street, the North Pier Steps, the Venelles leading from High Street to the Quay, Quay Street, Cow Lane, Saint Peter Port and the roads, quays, jetties and walks of the Harbour of Saint Peter Port.
2. New Road, Saint Sampson's, from its junction with Saint Sampson's Bridge to its junction with Brock Road.
3. Saint Sampson's Bridge.
4. Vale Avenue, Vale, from its junction with Saint Sampson's Bridge to its junction with Summerfield Road and Braye Road.

5. The roads and quays on the northern side of Saint Sampson's Harbour lying between Saint Sampson's Bridge and the Old North Pier.
