1994

Made 30th November, 1994.
Came into operation 30th November, 1994.

The Protection of Game Ordinance, 1994

THE STATES, pursuant to their Resolution of 28th September, 1994(a), hereby order:-

Close season for game

1.(1) The close season for game in any year is from 1st March to 30th September inclusive, or such other period as the Board may from time to time specify by an order made under this section.

(2) During the close season for game a person shall not:

(a) hunt or kill any game in Guernsey; or

(b) buy or sell any game originating in Guernsey.

(3) Paragraph (a) of subsection (2) does not extend so as to prohibit

(a) the owner or occupier of any land from hunting or killing any game on that land at any time of the year;

(a) on Article 22 of Billet d'État No. XVII of 1994.

- (b) any person having in his possession the authority in writing of the owner or occupier of any land from hunting or killing wild rabbits on that land at any time of the year.

Offences

2. A person who contravenes any provision of section 1 is guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the uniform scale.

Interpretation

3. In this Ordinance:

"the Board" means the States Agricultural and Milk Marketing Board;

"the close season" means the period for the time being specified by or under section 1(1);

"game" includes wild rabbits.

Repeals

4. The Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance pour la Protection du Gibier" of 1884(b), the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance Supplémentaire à l'Ordonnance pour la protection du Gibier of 1896(c), the Protection of Game (Amendment) Ordinance, 1989(d), and the Protection of Game (Modification) Ordinance, 1990(e) are repealed.
