## **The Protection of Wild Birds (Amendment) Ordinance, 1951.**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 19th day of September, 1951, hereby order:—

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Protection of Wild Birds Ordinance, 1949 (hereinafter referred to as the "principal Ordinance"), a person who is the holder of a current licence issued in accordance with the provisions of the "Loi relative aux Permis de Port d'Armes de Chasse" registered on the Records of this Island on the 30th day of August, 1922, may kill or attempt to kill:—

- (a) during the period beginning on the 1st day of October in any year and ending on the 31st day of January next following, the birds specified in the Schedule to this Ordinance ;

- (b) at any time, Cormorants and Shags.
2. This Ordinance shall be construed as one with the principal Ordinance.
  3. This Ordinance and the principal Ordinance may be cited together as the Protection of Wild Birds Ordinances, 1949 and 1951.
