**The Psittacosis (Amendment) Ordinance,  
1954.**

THE STATES, on the representations of the States Board of Health, hereby order:—

1. The Psittacosis Ordinance, 1953 (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Ordinance”) is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) section two thereof is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor—

“ 2. (1) A person shall not import or attempt to import a parrot into this Island from any place other than Great Britain, Jersey, Alderney or Sark.

(2) A person who imports or attempts to import a parrot into this Island in contravention of the provisions of the last preceding subsection shall be guilty of an offence and liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding ten pounds.”;

- (b) in section four thereof immediately after the word "Island" there are hereby inserted the words "from any place other than Great Britain, Jersey, Alderney or Sark";
- (c) in section seven thereof the words "includes the Islands of Herm and Jethou" are hereby deleted and the words "means any of the Islands of Guernsey, Herm and Jethou" are hereby substituted therefor.

2. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be taken to affect the movement of parrots between the Islands of Guernsey, Herm and Jethou.

3. This Ordinance and the principal Ordinance shall be construed as one, and may be cited together as the Psittacosis Ordinances, 1953 and 1954.
