The Penicillin and Allied Substances (Amendment) Ordinance, 1953

THE STATES, on the representations of the States Board of Health and the States Committee for Agriculture and Fisheries, hereby order: –

Amendment of s. 2(1) of 1950 Ordinance.

NOTE

Section 1 amended the Penicillin and Allied Substances Ordinance, 1950 ("the principal Ordinance"), which Ordinance has since been repealed by the Medicines (Human and Veterinary) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2008, section 135, Schedule 5, with effect from 1st October, 2009.

Exception.

2. Subsection (1) of section two of the principal Ordinance shall not apply to the sale or supply of a substance or preparation specified in an order made by the Board under this section, if it is sold or supplied in such circumstances and in accordance with such conditions as may be specified in that order.

NOTES

The following Order has been made under section 2:

Penicillin and Allied Substances Order, 1953.

The Penicillin and Allied Substances Ordinance, 1950 ("the principal Ordinance") has since been repealed by the Medicines (Human and Veterinary) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2008, section 135, Schedule 5, with effect from 1st October, 2009.

Penalty.

3. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of an order made under this Ordinance shall, on conviction, be liable to the same penalties as if he had committed an offence under the provisions of section two of the principal Ordinance.

Orders made by Board.

4. Every order made by the Board under the provisions of section two of this Ordinance or under the provisions of section two of the principal Ordinance shall be laid before a Meeting of the States as soon as may be after the making thereof and if, at that Meeting or at the next subsequent Meeting, the States resolve that the order be annulled, the order shall cease to have effect but without prejudice to anything done thereunder or to the making by the Board of any new order.

Construction and citation.

5. This Ordinance shall be construed as one with the principal Ordinance, and this Ordinance and the principal Ordinance may be cited together as the Penicillin and Allied Substances Ordinances, 1950 and 1953.

NOTE

The Ordinance was made and came into operation on 6th November, 1953.
