

Ordinance of the Chief Pleas

The People's Deputies (Additional By-Election) Ordinance, 1968

WHEREAS an election for the office of Deputy of the People left vacant by the resignation of Mr John Peter Guille was held on Thursday, the twenty-eighth day of December, nineteen hundred and sixty-seven:

AND WHEREAS at the said election two of the candidates secured an equal number of votes:

AND WHEREAS the addition of one vote to the poll of either of those candidates would have entitled the candidate concerned to have been declared elected:

AND WHEREAS section five of the Election of Deputies (Sark) Ordinance, 1952, provides that where at an election two or more candidates secure an equal number of votes and the addition of one vote to his poll would have entitled any such candidate to be declared elected, a further election shall be held, as soon as conveniently may be, in respect of such candidates only, which further election shall, for the purposes of the term of office of any successful candidate, be deemed to have been held on the date of the original election:

AND WHEREAS it is, therefore, necessary that a further election should be held for the office of Deputy of the People left vacant by the resignation of the said Mr John Peter Guille:

NOW THEREFORE THE CHIEF PLEAS OF SARK, under and by virtue of the powers vested in them by section twelve of the Reform (Sark) Law, 1951, hereby order:-

A further election for the office of Deputy of the People left vacant by the resignation of Mr John Peter Guille shall be held on Tuesday the thirtieth day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty-eight.
