Ordinance of the States. **XXIV**
1950

Made 19th July, 1950.
Coming into operation 1st September, 1950.

The Refuse Disposal Ordinance, 1950.

THE STATES, on the representations of the States Board of Health and, as respects section 3 hereof, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 17th day of May, 1950, hereby order:—

1. There are hereby repealed—

- (1) the Ordonnance ayant rapport à la Disposition de Rebut (1946); and
- (2) the Ordonnance portant amendement à l'Ordonnance ayant rapport à la Disposition de Rebut (1946), of the 29th day of March, 1947.

2. No person shall place, or leave with intent to abandon the same, any refuse or anything which by being abandoned may become refuse, in any public place or place to which the public have access, or in any unoccupied place or, save with the consent of

the occupier, in any occupied place, unless such refuse or thing be placed and left in a suitable container or place intended for the receipt of refuse.

3. A person who offers refuse for collection shall so offer the same in a dust-bin or other suitable metal container and shall ensure so far as is reasonable that while such refuse is awaiting collection the dust-bin or container is covered at all times with a properly-fitting lid or cover.

4. A person who contravenes or attempts to contravene or assists another person in the contravention or attempted contravention of any provision of this Ordinance shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction, if the offence is an offence against section 2 hereof, to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to both such fine and such imprisonment, and if the offence is an offence against section 3 hereof, to a fine not exceeding five pounds.

5. This Ordinance shall come into force on the 1st day of September, 1950.
