**THE REMOVAL OF VEHICLES (TEMPORARY  
PROVISIONS) ORDINANCE, 1989**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 10<sup>th</sup> day of May 1989 and in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 46 of, and paragraph (1) of Schedule 2 to, the Government of Alderney Law, 1987, hereby order:-

**Temporary ban on vehicles on certain highways.**

1. A person shall not permit a vehicle to be or remain on any part of the public highways shown coloured yellow on the map bearing the title of this Ordinance which has been signed by the Vice-President on the 24<sup>th</sup> April, 1989 and deposited at the States Office.

**Removal of vehicles.**

2.(1) An officer of police to whom it appears that a vehicle has been permitted to be or remain on a public highway in contravention of section 1 of this Ordinance may -

- (a) require any person appearing to him to be in charge of the vehicle to remove it to such place as he may reasonably direct; or
- (b) himself remove it, or arrange for its removal, to such place as he may reasonably determine.

(2) An officer of police acting pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of this section -

- (a) may remove the vehicle, or arrange for its removal, in such manner as he thinks necessary or expedient;
- (b) may take, or arrange for the taking of, such other measures in relation to the vehicle as he thinks necessary or expedient;
- (c) is not liable, if he has acted in good faith, for any loss or damage suffered as a result of such removal or other measures.

## **Offences.**

3.(1) A person who contravenes section 1 of this Ordinance is guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding £200.

(2) A person who obstructs, or fails to comply with a requirement made by, an officer of police acting in accordance with section 2 of this Ordinance is guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding £500, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months, or to both.

## **Interpretation.**

4. In this Ordinance -

“officer of police” includes a member of the salaried police force of the Island of Guernsey a special constable within the meaning of the Government of Alderney Law, 1987 and anybody acting under the authority of such a person;

“public highway” includes the whole of the road, street, lane or other place to which the public have vehicular access;

“vehicle” means anything made or adapted for the conveyance on land of people or property.

## **Citation.**

5. This Ordinance may be cited as the Removal of Vehicles (Temporary Provisions) Ordinance, 1989.

## **Commencement and duration.**

6.(1) This Ordinance shall come into force at 11.30 on such day as the States of Alderney Finance Committee may appoint by an order made under this section and shall cease to have effect at 1600 hours on the day so appointed, but without prejudice to any liability incurred whilst it was in force or to the institution and prosecution of proceedings in respect of any act of default which occurred whilst it was in force.

(2) It is hereby declared that -

- (a) only one order may be made under this section; and
- (b) the order may appoint only one day; and
- (c) the order must be made at least three clear days before the day appointed by it.

**THE REMOVAL OF VEHICLES**

**TEMPORARY PROVISIONS ORDER 1989**

The States of Alderney Finance committee in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by Section 6(1) of the Ordinance entitled "The Removal of Vehicles Temporary Provisions Ordinance 1989" hereby orders that the said Ordinance shall come into force at 1130 hours on MONDAY the 29<sup>th</sup> MAY 1989 and shall cease to have effect at 1600 hours on the same day.

This Order may be cited as The Removal of Vehicles Temporary Provisions Order 1989.
