Ordinance of the States V 2004

Made 21st April 2004
Coming into force 21st April 2004

THE ROAD TRAFFIC (RESTRICTIONS ON USE OF MOBILE TELEPHONES) (ALDERNEY) ORDINANCE, 2004

THE STATES OF ALDERNEY, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 46 of the Government of Alderney Law, 1987¹ and all other powers enabling them, hereby:—

- 1. (1) If any person who is driving a motor vehicle on a road holds a telephone in any way while the vehicle is in motion, he shall be guilty of an offence. **Restriction on use of telephones.**
- (2) A person guilty of an offence under subsection (1) shall be liable to a fine not exceeding level 2 of the Alderney uniform scale of fines.

- 2. (1) In this Ordinance - **Interpretation.**

"motor vehicle" means a mechanically propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on a road; and

"road" means any road, street, lane, way or place which is a public highway or to which the public have access, and includes any road owned by the States which is not a public highway.

(2) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948² applies to the interpretation of this Ordinance as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey enactment.

(3) A reference in this Ordinance to an enactment shall, except where the context otherwise requires, include a reference thereto as amended, repealed and replaced (with or without modifications), extended or applied.

Citation.

3. This Ordinance may be cited as the Road Traffic (Restriction on Use of Mobile Telephones) (Alderney) Ordinance, 2004.

Commencement.

4. This Ordinance shall come into force on the 21st April 2004.
