The Royal Visit (Bank Holiday) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1957.

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-fourth day of April, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven, hereby order:—

1. (1) Friday, the twenty-sixth day of July, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven, being the occasion of a visit to this Island of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second and His Royal Highness the Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, shall be a bank holiday for the purposes of the Bank Holidays and Negotiable Instruments (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1955.

(2) The said Friday, the twenty-sixth day of July, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven, shall be a "jour de relâche" for the purposes of the Ordinance entitled

“Ordonnance contenant les Règlements pour le Greffe” of the twenty-fifth day of October, nineteen hundred and thirty, as amended.

2. The Registry of Deaths Ordinance, 1949, as amended, shall have effect as respects nineteen hundred and fifty-seven as though in subsection two of section two thereof there were inserted immediately after the words “Whit Monday” the words “Friday, the twenty-sixth day of July, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven, being the occasion of a visit to this Island of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second and His Royal Highness the Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh”.

3. This Ordinance shall have effect in the Islands of Guernsey, Herm and Jethou.
