The Spirits (Amendment) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1960

ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS

1. Application of Ordinance of 1931 in relation to perfumed spirits and toilet preparations.
2. Recovery of alcohol contained in perfumes and toilet preparations prohibited.

The Spirits (Amendment) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1960

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the third day of August, nineteen hundred and sixty, hereby order: –

Application of Ordinance of 1931 in relation to perfumed spirits and toilet preparations.

1. The provisions of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance ayant rapport à la Perception de l'Impôt sur les Liqueurs Spiritueuses" made permanent on the fifth day of October, nineteen hundred and thirty-one (hereinafter referred to as "**the principal Ordinance**") shall apply in relation to perfumed spirits and toilet preparations as those provisions apply in relation to all medical tinctures, extracts, infusions and other alcoholic preparations and alcohol intended for use for any medical purpose.

NOTE

The Ordonnance ayant rapport à la perception de l'Impôt sur les Liqueurs Spiritueuses, 1931 has since been repealed by the Customs and Excise (General Provisions) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) (Amendment) Law, 2003, section 7, Second Schedule, paragraph 6, with effect from 1st October, 2004.

Recovery of alcohol contained in perfumes and toilet preparations prohibited.

2. Any person who recovers or attempts to recover the spirit or alcohol contained in any perfume or toilet preparation by distillation or condensation or in any other manner shall be guilty of an offence under this Ordinance and shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding [level 2 on the uniform scale].

NOTE

In section 2, the words and figure in square brackets were substituted by the Uniform Scale of Fines (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 1989, section 2(2), with effect from 1st July, 1989.

Offences by body corporate.

3. Where a person convicted of an offence under the principal Ordinance or under this Ordinance is a body corporate, every person who, at the time of the commission of the offence, was a director or officer of the body corporate, or was purporting to act in any such capacity, shall be deemed to be guilty of that offence unless he proves that the offence was committed without his knowledge, or that he exercised all due diligence to prevent the commission of the offence.

Citation.

4. This Ordinance may be cited as the Spirits (Amendment) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1960, and this Ordinance, the principal Ordinance and the Spirits (Sealed Containers) (Refund of Duty) Ordinance, 1950, may be cited together as the Spirits (Guernsey) Ordinances, 1931 to 1960.

Commencement.

5. This Ordinance shall come into force on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty-one.
