**The Spirits (Amendment) Ordinance, 1969**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the thirtieth day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty-nine, hereby order:—

1. The provisions of the Ordinance entitled “Ordonnance ayant rapport à la Perception de l'Impôt sur les Liqueurs Spiritueuses”, of the fifth day of October, nineteen hundred and thirty-one<sup>(a)</sup>, shall not apply in relation to intoxicating liquor in confectionery which—

Ordinance of 1931 not to apply to liqueur chocolates.

- (a) does not contain liquor in a proportion greater than one fiftieth of a gallon of liquor (computed as proof spirit) per pound of the confectionery; and
- (b) either consists of separate pieces each weighing not more than one and a half ounces or is designed to be broken into such pieces for the purposes of consumption.
