Made 24th April, 1968.
Came into Operation 24th April, 1968.

**The September Bank Holiday Ordinance,
1968.**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-fifth day of October, nineteen hundred and sixty-seven, hereby order:—

1. The first Monday in the month of September, nineteen hundred and sixty-eight, shall be a bank holiday instead of the first Monday of August in that year.

First Monday in September, 1968, to be Bank Holiday.

2. The references in—

- (a) Article I of the Ordinance entitled “Ordonnance contenant les Règlements pour le Greffe” of the twenty-fifth day of October, nineteen hundred and thirty(a);
- (b) paragraph (2) of section two of the Registry of Deaths Ordinance, 1949(b);

References in certain Ordinances to the first Monday in August to be construed, as respects 1968, as references to first Monday in September.

to the first Monday in the month of August shall be construed, as respects the year nineteen hundred and sixty-eight, as references to the first Monday in the month of September.

- Repeal. 3. The May and August Bank Holidays Ordinance, 1967(d), is hereby repealed.
- Extent. 4. This Ordinance shall have effect in the Islands of Guernsey, Herm and Jethou.
- Citation. 5. This Ordinance may be cited as the September Bank Holiday Ordinance, 1968.
