**The September Bank Holiday Ordinance,
1969**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the thirtieth day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty-nine, hereby order:—

1. (1) The first Monday in the month of September, nineteen hundred and sixty-nine, shall be a bank holiday instead of the first Monday of August in that year.

First Monday in September, 1969, to be bank holiday.

(2) The reference in section two of the Bank Holidays and Negotiable Instruments (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1955(a), to the first Monday in the month of August shall be construed, as respects the year nineteen hundred and sixty-nine, as a reference to the first Monday in the month of September.

2. The September Bank Holiday Ordinance, 1968(b), is hereby repealed.

Extent. 3. This Ordinance shall have effect in the Islands of Guernsey, Herm and Jethou.

Citation. 4. This Ordinance may be cited as the September Bank Holiday Ordinance, 1969.
