**The Service of Process, etc. (Prohibition)
(Repeal) Ordinance, 1955.**

WHEREAS by Ordinance dated the sixth day of April, 1797, the service on any inhabitant of this Island of citations, other than those issued under the authority of the Royal Court of this Island, was prohibited:

AND WHEREAS such a prohibition may, in certain cases, impede the administration of justice elsewhere:

AND WHEREAS a like prohibition directed against the service out of this Island of citations issued under the authority of the Royal Court of this Island appears not to exist elsewhere:

NOW THEREFORE the States, without prejudice to the rights conferred by Royal Charter on the inhabitants of this Island and Bailiwick and without prejudice to the right of any person sued in the Royal Court of Guernsey on a judgment obtained elsewhere than in this Island to show cause why effect should not be given to that judgment in this Island, hereby repeals the said Ordinance of the sixth day of April, 1797.
