"VESSELS ARRIVING FROM FOREIGN PORTS ORDINANCE (SARK) 1956"

In connection with the resolution of the Chief-Pleas passed at the Michaelmas Meeting held on the 5th of October, 1955, the Chief-Pleas hereby orders:-

1. The masters of vessels coming direct from foreign ports who intend to land shall fly a yellow flag on approaching the Island of Sark.
 2. No dutiable goods shall be put ashore without the master first making a declaration to the Constables or to the Island Treasurer as to the nature of the goods which it is wished to land and without paying to the Island Treasurer the appropriate duty thereon.
 3. No dogs shall be allowed ashore.
 4. The penalty on conviction for a first offence against this ordinance shall not exceed £2 and for subsequent offences shall not exceed £5, and, in addition, at the discretion of the Seneschal's Court, confiscation of such goods as may be landed in contravention of section 2.
 5. The above sections with the necessary instructions to enable masters to get in touch with the Constables or the Island Treasurer shall be written in French and in English on notice boards to be placed at all Harbours.
