**The Waste Food Ordinance, 1987**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 27th day of May, 1987, hereby order:—

1. No person shall—

(a) feed waste food, or supply waste food for feeding, to any livestock or poultry; or

(b) cause or permit waste food to be so fed or supplied.

Prohibition  
on feeding  
waste food.

2. A person who contravenes section 1 is guilty of an offence and liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding £500.

Offences.

3. In this Ordinance—

“livestock” means cattle, sheep, goats and pigs;

“poultry” means all species of fowl, turkey, goose, duck, guinea fowl, pigeon, pheasant, partridge and quail;

Interpreta-  
tion.

“waste food” means—

- (a) meat, bones, blood, offal or any other part of the carcass of any animal or bird, or any product derived therefrom;
- (b) hatchery waste, eggs or eggshells;
- (c) any broken or waste foodstuffs, including table or kitchen scraps, which contain or have been in contact with anything mentioned in (a) or (b).

**Extent.** 4. This Ordinance has effect in the Islands of Guernsey, Herm and Jethou.

**Citation.** 5. This Ordinance may be cited as the Waste Food Ordinance, 1987.

**Commencement.** 6. This Ordinance shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1988.
