**The Waterworks Byelaws (Amendment)  
Ordinance, 1954.**

WHEREAS the States Water Board on the second day of April, 1954, made the byelaw set out in the Schedule to this Ordinance.

NOW THEREFORE, the States, on the representations of the States Water Board and in pursuance of the powers now vested in them by Article thirty

of the Law entitled "Loi ayant rapport à la Fourniture d'Eau par les Etats de cette Ile aux Habitants de la dite Ile" registered on the Records of this Island on the 7th day of May, 1927, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by section one of the Alderney (Application of Legislation) Law, 1948, hereby sanction the said byelaw and order:—

1. The byelaws set out in the Schedule to the Waterworks Byelaws Ordinance, 1948, shall have effect subject to the amendment set out in the byelaw scheduled to this Ordinance. Amendment

2. This Ordinance shall have effect in the Islands of Guernsey and Alderney. Application.
3. This Ordinance may be cited as the Waterworks Byelaws (Amendment) Ordinance, 1954, and this Ordinance and the Waterworks Byelaws Ordinances, 1938 and 1948, may be cited together as the Waterworks Byelaws Ordinances, 1938 to 1954. Citation.

#### SCHEDULE

Byelaw 2 of the byelaws set out in the Schedule to the Waterworks Byelaws Ordinance, 1948, is hereby repealed and the following byelaw numbered 2 is hereby substituted therefor—

"2. Subject to the provisions of byelaw 4 of these byelaws, a water fitting shall comply with so much of any British Standard applicable to that fitting as relates to the size, nature, materials, strength and workmanship of such fitting and notwithstanding any of the other provisions of these byelaws, that Standard shall be the Standard for the time being applicable to that fitting and shall be deemed to be satisfied notwithstanding any departure from that Standard if, in the opinion of the Board, that departure does not adversely affect the efficiency or stability of the fitting in relation to the purposes for which these byelaws are made."
