



ORDER IN COUNCIL.



IN THE ROYAL COURT OF THE ISLAND OF GUERNSEY.

The 23rd day of June, 1951, before Sir Ambrose James Sherwill, C.B.E., M.C., Bailiff; present:— Osmond Priaulx Gallienne, Esquire, Ernest de Garis, Esquire, O.B.E., Sir John Leale, Arthur Falla, Walter John Sarre, William Robert Freake Clark, Walter John Gavey, Ernest Francis Lainé, Bertram Bartlett, Esquires, Donald Carey Brock, Esquire, C.B.E., and Osmond Priaulx, Esquire, Jurats.

The Bailiff having this day placed before the Court an Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 31st day of May, 1951, ratifying a *Projet de Loi* entitled "The Driving Licences Suspension (Guernsey) Law, 1951",—the Court, after the reading of the said Order in Council and after having heard His Majesty's Procureur thereon, ordered that the said Order in Council be registered on the records of this Island, of which Order in Council the tenor followeth:—

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Report from the Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Council for the Affairs of Guernsey and Jersey, dated the 22nd day of May, 1951, in the words following, viz. :—

“YOUR MAJESTY having been pleased, by Your General Order of Reference of the 18th day of December, 1936, to refer unto this Committee the humble Petition of the States of the Island of Guernsey, setting forth :—

‘ 1. That, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 17th day of January, 1951, the States of Deliberation at a meeting held on the 7th day of March, 1951, approved a Bill or “Projet de Loi” entitled “The Driving Licences Suspension (Guernsey) Law, 1951” and requested the Bailiff to present a most humble Petition to Your Majesty in Council praying for Your Royal Sanction thereto: 2. That the said Bill or “Projet de Loi” is in the words and figures set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed. And most humbly praying that Your Majesty might be graciously pleased to grant Your Royal Sanction to the Bill or “Projet de Loi” of the States

of Guernsey entitled "The Driving Licences Suspension (Guernsey) Law, 1951" and to order that the same shall have the force of Law in the Island of Guernsey.'

"THE LORDS OF THE COMMITTEE, in obedience to Your Majesty's said Order of Reference, have taken the said Petition and the said Projet de Loi into consideration, and do this day agree humbly to report, as their opinion, to Your Majesty, that it may be advisable for Your Majesty to comply with the prayer of the said Petition and to approve of and ratify the said Projet de Loi."

HIS MAJESTY having taken the said Report into consideration is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of and ratify the said Projet de Loi, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the same shall have the force of Law within the Island of Guernsey.

AND HIS MAJESTY doth hereby further direct that this Order, and the said Projet de Loi (a copy whereof is hereunto annexed) be entered upon the Register of the Island of Guernsey and observed accordingly.

AND the Lieutenant-Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Island of Guernsey, the Bailiff and Jurats, and all other His Majesty's Officers, for the time being, in the said Island, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

**Projet de Loi referred to in the foregoing
Order in Council.**

PROJET DE LOI

ENTITLED

The Driving Licences Suspension (Guernsey) Law, 1951.

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 17th day of January, 1951, have approved the following provisions, which, subject to the Sanction of His Most Excellent Majesty in Council, shall have force of law in this Island.

1. Notwithstanding any of the provisions of the Loi Supplémentaire à la Loi relative aux Automobiles, 1932, or of the Road Traffic (Compulsory Third-Party Insurance) (Guernsey) Law, 1936, the Court, in ordering any suspension of or disqualification from holding or applying for a driving licence under either of those Laws, may direct that such suspension or disqualification shall relate to one or some only of the categories of driving licence.

2. The provisions of this Law shall not apply to any order made in consequence of a conviction under the Road Traffic (Driving under the influence of Drink or Drugs) Law, 1948.
