**The Driving Tests (Amendment and
Transfer of Functions) Ordinance, 1990**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolutions of the 28th day of September, 1989(a), hereby order:—

1. The functions of the Island Police Committee and of the Chief Officer of Police arising under or by virtue of Article VIII(4) of the “Ordonnance relative au Trafic vehiculaire en cette Ile” of the 2nd March 1929, as amended(b) (“the principal Ordinance”) are respectively transferred to and vested in the Committee and the President or Chief Officer of the Committee. Transfer of Functions.
2. In this Ordinance “the Committee” means the Island Traffic Committee, or such other Committee or like body of the States as the States may from time to time prescribe by Resolution. Definition.

Savings.

3. Nothing done by or in relation to the Island Police Committee or the Chief Officer of Police under or by virtue of the principal Ordinance before the commencement of this Ordinance shall be invalidated by such commencement.

4. (1) In Article 1 of the principal Ordinance add the following definition:—

“The expression “The Committee” in relation to Article VIII(4) of this Ordinance shall mean the Island Traffic Committee, or such other Committee or like body of the States as the States may from time to time prescribe by Resolution.”.

(2) In Article VIII(4) of the principal Ordinance:—

- (a) delete “the Chief Officer of Police” and substitute “the President or Chief Officer of the Committee”;
- (b) delete “a fee of £10 which sum shall not be returnable” and substitute “a fee of £12, which sum may be repaid:—
 - (a) if an appointment for a test is subsequently cancelled by or on behalf of the Committee; or
 - (b) if the person for whom the appointment is made keeps the appointment but the test does not take place or is not completed for reasons attributable neither to him, nor to any vehicle he provides for the purposes of the test; or
 - (c) if the person for whom the appointment is made fails to keep the appointment

due to ill-health subject to the person furnishing the Committee with a certificate from a medical practitioner registered to practise in the Bailiwick; or

- (d) if the person for whom the appointment is made gives notice of cancellation to the Committee or a person authorised by them not less than 7 clear days (excluding Saturdays, Sundays, Bank Holidays, Christmas Day or Good Friday) before the day of the appointment.”.

5. This Ordinance may be cited as the Driving Tests (Amendment and Transfer of Functions) Ordinance, 1990. Citation.

6. This Ordinance shall come into force on 17th April, 1990. Commencement.
