ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS

1. Amendment of 1905 Law.
2. Citation.

The Explosives (Guernsey) (Amendment) Law, 1951

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 8th day of November, 1950, have approved the following provisions, which, subject to the Sanction of His Most Excellent Majesty in Council, shall have force of law in this Island.

Amendment of 1905 Law.

1. The Loi relative aux Explosifs, registered on the Records of this Island on the 4th day of February, 1905, as amended by the Order in Council registered on the 25th day of July, 1905 (hereinafter referred to as "**the principal Law**") is hereby amended as follows –

- (1) In section XVII thereof, for the words "à la Cour Royale siégeant en Cour Ordinaire" and "la dite Cour Royale" there shall respectively be substituted the words "au Conseil Administratif des Etats" and "le dit Conseil".¹
- (2) In the second paragraph, which begins with the words "Il sera de plus payé", of section XXIX thereof, by the deletion of the words "d'une Licence d'Importation" and of the comma immediately preceding those words, and by the insertion, after the words "Greffier du Roi", where those words secondly occur, of the words "et lors de l'octroi d'une Licence d'Importation, la somme de dix chelins aux États".²

NOTES

In accordance with the provisions of the Health and Safety at Work etc.

(Guernsey) Law, 1979, section 7, Schedule, with effect from 13th November, 1979, this enactment is one of those that the States may repeal or modify by Ordinance made under the said section 7.

In accordance with the provisions of the Health and Safety at Work (General) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1987, section 35(1), Schedule 4, with effect from 1st December, 1987, this enactment is one of those to be regarded as "relevant statutory provisions" for the purposes of the 1987 Ordinance.

Citation.

2. The principal Law may be cited as the Explosives (Guernsey) Law, 1905, the Loi supplémentaire à la Loi relative aux Explosifs, registered on the Records of this Island on the 28th day of March, 1914, may be cited as the Explosives (Guernsey) (Amendment) Law, 1914, and the Laws in this section referred to may be cited together with this Law as the Explosives (Guernsey) Laws, 1905 to 1951.

NOTE

The Law received Royal Sanction on 29th January, 1951 and was registered on the Records of the Island of Guernsey and came into force on 17th February, 1951.
