ORDER IN COUNCIL



IN THE ROYAL COURT OF THE ISLAND OF GUERNSEY

The 2nd day of March, 1965, before Dr. Francis Coningsby, Lieutenant-Bailiff; present: Sir John Leale, Wilfred John Corbet, Esquire, O.B.E., Théophile Le Messurier Allez, Bertram Guy Blampied, Claude Fortescue Nason, Stanley Walter Gavey, Esquires, Gilbert Carey de Jersey, Esquire, C.B., Carl Edward Blad, Albert Victor Dorey, Esquires, Laurence Francis de Vic Carey, Esquire, C.B., C.B.E., D'Arcy George Le Tissier, and William Burton Fox, Esquires, Jurats.

The Lieutenant-Bailiff having this day placed before the Court an Order of Her Majesty in Council dated the 29th day of January, 1965, ratifying a *Projet de Loi* entitled "The Family Allowances (Amendment) Law, 1965", the Court, after the reading of the said Order in Council and after having heard Her Majesty's Procureur thereon, ordered that the said Order in Council be registered on the records of this Island and that an extract of this present Act, together with a copy of the said Order in Council, be sent by Her Majesty's Greffier to the Clerk of the Court of Alderney for registration on the records of that Island, of which Order in Council the tenor followeth:—

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Report from the Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Council for the Affairs of Guernsey and Jersey, dated the 5th day of January, 1965, in the words following, viz.:—

“YOUR MAJESTY having been pleased, by Your General Order of Reference of the 22nd day of February, 1952, to refer unto this Committee the humble Petition of the States of the Island of Guernsey, setting forth:—

1. That, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 29th day of July, 1964, the States of Deliberation at a meeting held on the 25th day of November, 1964, approved a Bill or “Projet de Loi” entitled “The Family Allowances (Amendment) Law, 1965” and requested the Bailiff to present a most humble Petition to Your Majesty in Council praying for Your Royal Sanction thereto. 2. That the said Bill or “Projet de Loi” is in the words and figures set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed. And most humbly praying that Your Majesty might be graciously pleased to grant Your Royal Sanction to the Bill or “Projet de Loi” of the States of Guernsey

entitled "The Family Allowances (Amendment) Law, 1965" and to order that the same shall have force of law in the Islands of Guernsey, Alderney, Herm and Jethou."

"THE LORDS OF THE COMMITTEE, in obedience to Your Majesty's said Order of Reference, have taken the said Petition and the said Projet de Loi into consideration, and do this day agree humbly to report, as their opinion, to Your Majesty, that it may be advisable for Your Majesty to comply with the prayer of the said Petition and to approve of and ratify the said Projet de Loi."

HER MAJESTY having taken the said Report into consideration is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of and ratify the said Projet de Loi, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the same shall have the force of Law within the Islands of Guernsey, Alderney, Herm and Jethou.

AND HER MAJESTY doth hereby further direct that this Order, and the said Projet de Loi (a copy whereof is hereunto annexed) be entered upon the Register of the Island of Guernsey and observed accordingly.

AND the Lieutenant Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Island of Guernsey, the Bailiff and Jurats, and all other Her Majesty's Officers, for the time being, in the said Island, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

PROJET DE LOI

ENTITLED

The Family Allowances (Amendment) Law, 1965

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-ninth day of July, nineteen hundred and sixty-four, have approved the following provisions which, subject to the Sanction of Her Most Excellent Majesty in Council, shall have force of law in the Islands of Guernsey, Alderney, Herm and Jethou.

Amendment
to Law
of 1950.

1. In the definition of the expression "apprentice" in subsection (1) of section twenty-one of the Family Allowances (Guernsey) Law, 1950, as amended^(a), the words "not in receipt of earnings which provide him, wholly or substantially, with a livelihood." are hereby repealed and the words "not in receipt of earnings of an amount exceeding forty shillings per week or such other amount per week as the States may, from time to time, by Ordinance determine, calculated or estimated, as the case may require, in such manner and on such basis as may be prescribed;" are hereby substituted therefor.

2. (1) This Law may be cited as the Family Allowances (Amendment) Law, 1965.
