ORDER IN COUNCIL



IN THE ROYAL COURT OF THE ISLAND OF GUERNSEY

The 27th day of March, 1984 before Sir Charles Frossard, Kt., Bailiff; present:—Albert Richard McCartney Straw, Esquire, Lionel Walter Sarre, Esquire, M.B.E., K.P.M., Donald Pescott Plummer, Esquire, Sydney Haydn Heard, Esquire, M.B.E., Charles Henry Hodder, Esquire, O.B.E., Harry Wilson Bisson, Herbert Nicolle Machon, James de Sausmarez Carey, John Christopher Bulstrode, Geoffrey Ernest Le Page and Stanley Walter John Jehan, Esquires, Jurats.

The Bailiff having this day placed before the Court an Order of Her Majesty in Council dated the 14th day of March, 1984 ratifying a *Projet de Loi* of the States of Guernsey entitled “The Family Allowances (Guernsey) (Amendment) Law, 1984”, the Court, after the reading of the said Order in Council and after having heard Her Majesty’s Procureur thereon, ordered that the said Order in Council be registered on the records of this Island, of which Order in Council the tenor followeth:—

PRESENT,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Report from the Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Council for the Affairs of Guernsey and Jersey dated the 21st day of February 1984 in the words following, viz.:—

“YOUR MAJESTY having been pleased, by Your General Order of Reference of the 22nd day of February 1952, to refer unto this Committee the humble Petition of the States of the Island of Guernsey setting forth:—

‘1. That, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 28th day of July 1983, the States of Deliberation at a meeting held on the 28th day of September 1983 approved a Bill or “Projet de Loi” entitled “The Family Allowances (Guernsey) (Amendment) Law, 1984”, and requested the Bailiff to present a most humble Petition to Your Majesty in Council praying for Your Royal Sanction thereto. 2. That the said Bill or “Projet de Loi” is in the words and figures set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed. And most humbly praying that Your Majesty might be graciously pleased to grant Your Royal Sanction to the Bill or “Projet de Loi” of the States of Guernsey entitled “The Family Allowances (Guernsey) (Amendment) Law, 1984”, and to order that the same shall have force of law in the Islands of Guernsey, Alderney, Herm and Jethou.’

“THE LORDS OF THE COMMITTEE, in obedience to Your Majesty’s said Order of Reference, have taken the said Petition and the said Projet de Loi into consideration and do this day agree humbly to report, as their opinion, to Your Majesty, that it may be advisable for Your Majesty to comply with the prayer of the said Petition and to approve of and ratify the said Projet de Loi.”

HER MAJESTY having taken the said Report into consideration is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of and ratify the said Projet de Loi, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the same shall have the force of Law within the Islands of Guernsey, Alderney, Herm and Jethou.

AND HER MAJESTY doth hereby further direct that this Order, and the said Projet de Loi (a copy whereof is hereunto annexed), be entered upon the Register of the Island of Guernsey and observed accordingly.

AND the Lieutenant Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Island of Guernsey, the Bailiff and Jurats, and all other Her Majesty’s Officers for the time being in the said Island, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

PROJET DE LOI

ENTITLED

The Family Allowances (Guernsey) (Amendment) Law, 1984

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-eighth day of July, nineteen hundred and eighty-three, have approved the following provisions which, subject to the Sanction of Her Most Excellent Majesty in Council, shall have force of law in the Islands of Guernsey, Alderney, Herm and Jethou.

1. In subsection (2) of section five of the Family Allowances (Guernsey) Law, 1950(a), as amended(b), the proviso to that subsection is hereby repealed and for the colon immediately preceding that proviso there is hereby substituted a full-stop.

2. Notwithstanding the repeal of the proviso to subsection (2) of section five of the said Law of 1950, as amended, by section one of this Law, the provisions of that Law, as amended, shall continue to have effect in relation to any award or decision of the Administrator made under that Law before the commencement of this Law in all respects as if this Law had not been passed.

3. (1) This Law may be cited as the Family Allowances (Guernsey) (Amendment) Law, 1984.
