The Fort Le Marchant Rifle Range (Safety and Control) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1980

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the thirtieth day of July, nineteen hundred and eighty, hereby order:—

1. The First and Second Schedules to the Fort Le Marchant Rifle Range (Safety and Control) Ordinance, 1955, as amended^(a), are hereby repealed and the Schedules set out in the First and Second Schedules to this Ordinance are respectively substituted therefor. Amendments to Ordinance of 1955.

2. This Ordinance may be cited as the Fort Le Marchant Rifle Range (Safety and Control) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1980. Citation.

3. This Ordinance and the Fort Le Marchant Rifle Range (Safety and Control) Ordinances, 1955 to 1976, may be cited together as the Fort Le Marchant Rifle Range (Safety and Control) Ordinances, 1955 to 1980. Collective title.

PART I

Weapons which may be fired and ammunition which may be discharged on the six hundred yard range and the one hundred yard range

<i>Weapon</i>	<i>Ammunition</i>
Rifle	.303 marks IV and V and 7.62 millimetres, .22 rifle and .222 rifle
Light Machine Gun	.303 Bren and 7.62 millimetres
Sten Machine Gun	9 millimetres
Pistol	up to and including .455 pistol and, when discharging black powder ammunition, up to and including .75 pistol
2" Mortar	Smoke, green and red flares or illuminating stars
Musket	when discharging black powder ammunition, up to and including .75 musket

Weapons which may be fired and ammunition which may be discharged on the fifty metre range

<i>Weapon</i>	<i>Ammunition</i>
Rifle	.303 marks IV and V and 7.62 millimetres, .22 rifle and .222 rifle
Pistol	up to and including .455 pistol and, when discharging black powder ammunition, up to and including .75 pistol
Musket	when discharging black powder ammunition, up to and including .75 musket ”
