The Market Street (Closure) (Guernsey) Law, 2002

THE STATES, in pursuance of their resolution of the 1st November, 2001^a, have approved the following provisions which, subject to the Sanction of Her Most Excellent Majesty in Council, shall have force of law in the island of Guernsey.

Permanent closure of parts of Market Street.

1. (1) From the appointed day –
 - (a) the relevant parts of Market Street shall be closed and shall cease to be a public highway,
 - (b) the relevant parts of Market Street shall be deemed to be controlled land for the purposes of the Vehicular Traffic (Control of Parking on Certain States Land) Ordinance, 1988^b, and
 - (c) the relevant parts of Market Street and the land upon which they run shall vest for an estate of inheritance in the States of Guernsey.
- (2) In this Law –

"appointed day" means the day appointed by order of the States [Committee for the Environment & Infrastructure],

"the relevant parts of Market Street" means those parts of Market

Street and Market Square in Saint Peter Port which are situated at or towards the eastern end of the Market Building and which are shown on the plan signed for the purposes of this Law by the Bailiff and lodged at the Greffe.

NOTES

In section 1, the words in square brackets in the definition of the expression "appointed day" were substituted by the Organisation of States' Affairs (Transfer of Functions) Ordinance, 2016, section 2, Schedule 1, paragraph 4(a), with effect from 1st May, 2016.¹

The functions, rights and liabilities of the Environment Department and of its Minister or Deputy Minister arising under or by virtue of this Law were transferred to and vested in, respectively, the Committee for the Environment & Infrastructure and its President or Vice-President by the Organisation of States' Affairs (Transfer of Functions) Ordinance, 2016, section 1, Schedule 1, paragraph 4(a), with effect from 1st May, 2016, subject to the savings and transitional provisions in section 3 of the 2016 Ordinance.²

In accordance with the provisions of the Market Street (Closure) (Appointed Day) Order, 2004, article 1, the appointed day for the purposes of this Law shall be 4th January, 2005.

Amendment of Ordinance.

2. In the Schedule to the Vehicular Traffic (Control of Parking on Certain States Land) Ordinance, 1988, after item 11^c insert the following entry –

"12. The relevant parts of Market Street within the meaning of the Market Street (Closure) (Guernsey) Law, 2002."

Citation.

3. This Law may be cited as the Market Street (Closure) (Guernsey) Law, 2002.

NOTE

The Law received Royal Sanction on 26th March, 2002 and was registered on the Records of the Island of Guernsey and came into force on 29th April, 2002.
