**The Motor Vehicles (International  
Circulation) Ordinance, 1953.**

THE STATES, in exercise of the powers now vested in them under sections twelve and fourteen of the Road Traffic (Compulsory Third-Party Insurance) (Guernsey) Law, 1936, and article eighteen of the Law entitled "Loi relative aux Automobiles" registered on the 11th day of December, 1926, as amended, and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf, hereby order:—

1. The Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance par rapport aux Licences d'Automobiles accordables aux personnes faisant un séjour temporaire dans l'Ile" of the 28th day of November, 1931 (hereafter in this Ordinance referred to as "the principal Ordinance") shall have effect as though there were inserted at the end of Regulation six, as the proviso thereto, the following proviso:—

“Provided that no such Permit shall be issued by the Registration Authority unless there is produced to that Authority in respect of the vehicle—

- (i) a certificate of insurance within the meaning of the Road Traffic (Compulsory Third-Party Insurance) (Guernsey) Law, 1936, valid for the period of the Permit for which application is made; or
- (ii) a valid insurance card within the meaning of the Motor Vehicles (International Motor Insurance Card) Ordinance, 1953, such card being so produced during the period of validity specified therein; or
- (iii) if the vehicle has been brought into Guernsey before the first day of October, 1953, a certificate of foreign insurance within the meaning of the Road Traffic (Compulsory Third-Party Insurance) Ordinances, 1936-1937, valid for the period of the Permit for which application is made.”

2. The principal Ordinance may be cited as the Motor Vehicles (International Circulation) Ordinance, 1931, and the principal Ordinance and this Ordinance may be cited together as the Motor Vehicles (International Circulation) Ordinances, 1931 and 1953.

3. This Ordinance shall come into force on the first day of August, 1953.
