Ordinance of the States **XXXV**

1968

Made 25th September, 1968.

Coming into Operation 1st November, 1968.

The Motor Vehicles (Miscellaneous Provisions) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1968

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-sixth day of June, nineteen hundred and sixty-eight, hereby order:—

1. Section three of the Motor Vehicles (Miscellaneous Provisions) Ordinance, 1962, as amended^(a), is hereby repealed and the following section is hereby substituted therefor—

Amendment to Ordinance of 1962.

3. (1) A person shall—

“Protective helmets to be worn by persons driving or being carried on motor cycles.”

(a) while driving a motor cycle, or

(b) while being carried as a passenger on a motor cycle on a pillion,

wear a helmet securely fitted so as to afford to that person protection from injury in the event of an accident.

(2) Any person who contravenes the provisions of subsection (1) of this section shall be guilty of an offence and liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding five pounds, or in the case of a second or subsequent conviction, to a fine not exceeding ten pounds.”.

2. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Motor Vehicles (Miscellaneous Provisions) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1968, and this Ordinance and the Motor Vehicles (Miscellaneous Provisions) Ordinances, 1962 to 1967, may be cited together as the Motor Vehicles (Miscellaneous Provisions) Ordinances, 1962 to 1968.

(2) This Ordinance shall come into force on the first day of November, nineteen hundred and sixty-eight.
