**The Prohibited and One-Way Streets
(Amendment) (No. 2) Ordinance, 1960**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twelfth day of October, nineteen hundred and sixty, and on the representations of the Island Police Committee, hereby order:—

1. The Prohibited and One-Way Streets Ordinance, 1956, as amended, shall be further amended as follows:—

(a) in section six thereof the words “motor cycle” shall be deleted and the words “motor bicycle” shall be substituted therefor;

(b) in the Fourth Schedule thereto immediately after the words “Douit Lane” there shall

be inserted the words "That section which lies between two warning signs each marked "MOTOR BICYCLES PROHIBITED" of the lane leading from Cobo Road to La Ruelle des Corneilles, Castel, known as Les Cherfs."

Repeals. 2. Section two of the Prohibited and One-Way Streets (Amendment) Ordinance, 1960, is hereby repealed.

Collective title. 3. This Ordinance, the Prohibited and One-Way Streets (Amendment) Ordinance, 1960, and the Prohibited and One-Way Streets Ordinances, 1956 to 1958, may be cited together as the Prohibited and One-Way Streets Ordinances, 1956 to 1960.
