**The Prohibited and One-Way Streets
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1960**

THE STATES, on the representations of the
Island Police Committee, hereby order:—

1. The Prohibited and One-Way Streets Ordinance, 1956, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:—

- (a) in the Second Schedule thereto immediately after paragraph 33 there is hereby inserted the following additional paragraph numbered " 34 "—

" 34. That portion of Paris Street, St. Peter Port, from its junction with New Paris Road to St. George's Esplanade, downwards.";

- (b) in the Fourth Schedule thereto, immediately after the words " Fermain Lane " there are hereby inserted the following words—

"That section which lies between two warning signs each marked "MOTOR BICYCLES PROHIBITED" of the portion of the road leading from L'Ancrese Road, Vale, to La Grève Road which is commonly known as Douit Lane."

2. This Ordinance and the Prohibited and One-Way Streets Ordinances, 1956 to 1958, may be cited together as the Prohibited and One-Way Streets Ordinances, 1956 to 1960.
