**The Prohibited and One-Way Streets
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1968.**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-ninth day of November, nineteen hundred and sixty-seven, hereby order:—

1. The Prohibited and One-Way Streets Ordinance, 1956, as amended(*a*), is hereby further amended, as follows:— Amendments to Ordinance of 1956.

(*a*) paragraph (*b*) of section one thereof is hereby repealed and the following paragraph is hereby substituted therefor:—

“(*b*) drive or ride that vehicle, or cause or permit that animal to proceed, on or along any of the public highways set out in the Second Schedule to this Ordinance otherwise than in the direc-

tion and manner indicated in that Schedule in respect of that public highway, save that the provisions of this paragraph shall apply, as respects—

- (i) the public highway specified in paragraph five of the said Schedule, only during the period commencing on the fifteenth day of May and terminating on the thirtieth day of September in each year; and
 - (ii) the public highways specified in paragraph fifty-three and paragraph fifty-four of the said Schedule, only during the period commencing on the first day of June and terminating on the fifteenth day of September in each year between the hours of ten o'clock in the forenoon and seven o'clock in the afternoon on any of those days.”;
- (b) in the Second Schedule thereto immediately after paragraph 52 thereof there is hereby inserted the following additional paragraphs numbered “ 53 ” and “ 54 ”:—

“ 53. The roads surrounding the premises known as “ Petit Bôt Tea Rooms ” in the parishes of the Forest and Saint Martin, in a clockwise direction.

54. La Rue des Pages in the parish of Saint Martin from the north-eastern corner of the premises known as “ Petit Bôt Tea Rooms ” to its most easterly junction with La Rue de la Falaise, from South-West to North-East, i.e. up-hill.”.

2. This Ordinance may be cited as the Prohibited and One-Way Streets (Amendment) Ordinance, 1968. ^{Citation.}

3. This Ordinance and the Prohibited and One-Way Streets Ordinances, 1956 to 1967, may be cited together as the Prohibited and One-Way Streets Ordinances, 1956 to 1968. ^{Collective title.}
