The Prohibited and One-Way Streets (Amendment) Ordinance, 1973

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the first day of March, nineteen hundred and seventy-three, hereby order:—

1. The Prohibited and One-Way Streets Ordinance, 1970, as amended^(a), is hereby further amended as follows:—

(a) in Part I of the Second Schedule thereto immediately after paragraph 62 thereof there is inserted the following additional paragraph numbered “63”—

“63. The more south-easterly of the two unnamed lanes lying between Les Petites Fontaines and Victoria Road, Saint Peter Port, from South to North.”;

(b) in Part II of the Second Schedule thereto immediately after paragraph 6 thereof there

is inserted the following additional paragraph numbered "7"—

"7. La Ruelle des Deslisles, Castel, from a sign marked "NO ENTRY" placed near Les Beaucamps Secondary School in La Ruelle des Deslisles by the Island Police Committee to its junction with La Rue des Deslisles (otherwise known as Saint George's Road), from North-West to South-East.";

- (c) in Part VIII of the Second Schedule thereto immediately after paragraph 8 thereof there is inserted the following additional paragraph numbered "9"—

"9. The unnamed road lying to the west of Sandy Hook, Saint Sampson's, from its junction with Sandy Hook and Kimberley Avenue to its other junction with Sandy Hook, from East to West and North to South."

Amendment to Ordinance of 1972.

2. Section two of the Prohibited and One-Way Streets (Amendment) Ordinance, 1972(b), is hereby repealed and the following section is substituted therefor—

"2. This Ordinance may be cited as the Prohibited and One-Way Streets (Amendment) (No. 2) Ordinance, 1972."
