# ORDER IN COUNCIL



IN THE ROYAL COURT OF THE ISLAND OF GUERNSEY

The Bailiff having this day placed before the Court an Order of Her Majesty in Council dated the 29th day of August, 1963, ratifying a Projet de Loi entitled "The Public Assistance (Guernsey) (Amendment) Law, 1963", the Court, after the reading of the said Order in Council and after having heard Her Majesty's Procureur thereon, ordered that the said Order in Council be registered on the records of this Island, of which Order in Council the tenor followeth :—

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Report from the Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Council for the Affairs of Guernsey and Jersey, dated the 22nd day of August, 1963, in the words following, viz.:—

“YOUR MAJESTY having been pleased, by Your General Order of Reference of the 22nd day of February, 1952, to refer unto this Committee the humble Petition of the States of the Island of Guernsey, setting forth:—

‘1. That, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 25th day of January, 1961, the States of Deliberation at a meeting held on the 31st day of July, 1963, approved a Bill or “Projet de Loi” entitled “The Public Assistance (Guernsey) (Amendment) Law, 1963” and requested the Bailiff to present a most humble Petition to Your Majesty in Council praying for Your Royal Sanction thereto. 2. That the said Bill or “Projet de Loi” is in the words and figures set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed. And most humbly praying that Your Majesty might be graciously pleased to grant Your Royal Sanction to the Bill or “Projet de Loi” of the States of

Guernsey entitled "The Public Assistance (Guernsey) (Amendment) Law, 1963" and to order that the same shall have force of law in the Island of Guernsey.'


"THE LORDS OF THE COMMITTEE, in obedience to Your Majesty's said Order of Reference, have taken the said Petition and the said Projet de Loi into consideration, and do this day agree humbly to report, as their opinion, to Your Majesty, that it may be advisable for Your Majesty to comply with the prayer of the said Petition and to approve of and ratify the said Projet de Loi."

HER MAJESTY, having taken the said Report into consideration is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of and ratify the said Projet de Loi, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the same shall have the force of Law within the Island of Guernsey.

AND HER MAJESTY doth hereby further direct that this Order, and the said Projet de Loi (a copy whereof is hereunto annexed) be entered upon the Register of the Island of Guernsey and observed accordingly.

AND the Lieutenant Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Island of Guernsey, the Bailiff and Jurats, and all other Her Majesty's Officers, for the time being, in the said Island, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

## PROJET DE LOI

ENTITLED

### **The Public Assistance (Guernsey) (Amendment) Law, 1963.**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-fifth day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty-one, have approved the following provisions which, subject to the Sanction of Her Most Excellent Majesty in Council, shall have force of law in this Island.

1. Article XVII of the Public Assistance Law, 1937, as amended, (a) is hereby further amended— Amendment  
of Article  
XVII.

- (a) by deleting from paragraph (2) thereof the words “ and who shall be elected by the rate-payers of the said parish and ”;
- (b) by deleting paragraph (6) thereof and substituting therefor a new paragraph (6) as follows:—

“ (6) The Procureurs of the Poor in their respective parishes and the Overseers of the Poor in the Parish of Saint Peter Port shall be elected by those persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on that section of the Electoral Roll compiled in pursuance of the provisions of Part IV of the Reform (Guernsey) Law, 1948, as

amended, (b) which relates to the Electoral District constituted by that parish.”; and,  
 (c) by deleting paragraph (g) thereof.

Saving for existing officers.

2. Nothing herein contained shall affect the completion of the term of office of any Procureur of the Poor, or any Overseer of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Peter Port, in office on the coming into force of this Law.

Citation and collective title.

3. This Law may be cited as the Public Assistance (Guernsey) (Amendment) Law, 1963, and this Law and the Public Assistance (Guernsey) Laws, 1937 to 1957, may be cited together as the Public Assistance (Guernsey) Laws, 1937 to 1963.

Commencement.

4. This Law shall come into force on the first day of December, nineteen hundred and sixty-three.
