The Road Traffic (Airport Roads and Traffic Signals) Ordinance, 1957.

THE STATES, on the representations of the States Board of Administration, hereby order:—

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle or of an animal shall not, without the permission of the Airport Commandant or the duty Air Traffic Control Officer, proceed with that vehicle or animal or permit that animal to proceed on or along so much of La Planque Lane in the parishes of the Forest, St. Andrew and St. Saviour as extends from a point twenty yards to the west of the western side of the house known as Le Chalet to a point seventy yards to the east of the eastern side of the house known as La Croute.

2. A person being in charge of a vehicle or of an animal shall not proceed with that vehicle or animal or permit that animal to proceed on or along any highway bordering La Villiaze Airport in such manner as to pass any traffic signal on any such highway when that signal is displaying the word "STOP" illuminated in red except as permitted by a traffic signal.

3. (1) A person being in charge of a vehicle or of an animal shall not halt that vehicle or permit that animal to halt on any portion of any highway bordering La Villiaze Airport, otherwise than in an area bounded by white lines marked on La Villiaze Road near the premises known as "Waverley" and shall not move that vehicle from that area or permit that animal to move therefrom so long as the traffic signal situate near the front entrance to the said premises is displaying a light.

(2) A person being in charge of a vehicle or of an animal shall not emerge from the premises to the north of and immediately adjacent to the premises known as "Waverley" and proceed with that vehicle along La Villiaze Road or permit that animal to proceed along that highway so long as the light situate near the entrance to those premises is illuminated.

(3) A person being in charge of a vehicle or of an animal shall not emerge from either of the premises known as "Sans Ennui" or "Hillcrest" and proceed with that vehicle along Rouilas Lane or permit that animal to proceed along that highway so long as the lights bordering that highway and facing those premises are illuminated.

4. For the purposes of this Ordinance—
"animal" does not include a dog or a cat;

“ traffic signal ” includes any signal, warning, sign-post, direction post, sign or other device for the guidance or direction of persons using the highways; and

“ vehicle ” does not include a bicycle or a tricycle.

5. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of an offence and liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds and, on the second and every subsequent conviction, to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds.

6. The Road Traffic (Airport Roads and Traffic Signals) Ordinance, 1954, is hereby repealed.
