**The Road Traffic (Compulsory Third  
Party Insurance) (Amendment) (Guernsey)  
Ordinance, 1979**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-seventh day of September, nineteen hundred and seventy-three, in exercise of the powers now vested in them by section fourteen of the Road Traffic (Compulsory Third Party Insurance) (Guernsey) Law, 1936, as amended(*a*), and in exercise of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby order:—

1. Immediately after subsection (2) of section three of the Road Traffic (Compulsory Third Party Insurance) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1972, as amended(*b*) (hereafter in this Ordinance referred to as “the principal Ordinance”), there are hereby inserted the following two subsections—

“(3) In the case of a vehicle normally based in the territory of a member state of the Communities, other than the United Kingdom and Gibraltar, or of Austria, Czechoslovakia, Finland, the German Democratic Republic, Hungary, Norway, Sweden or Switzerland, a document issued by the insurer of a motor vehicle which indicates the name of the insurer, the number or other identifying particulars of the insurance policy issued in respect of the said vehicle and the period of the insurance cover may be produced in pursuance of section thirteen of the Law, as an alternative to the production of a certificate of insurance, as evidence that the said vehicle is not or was not being driven in contravention of section two of the Law.

(4) For the purposes of the last foregoing subsection, the territory of the state in which a motor vehicle is normally based shall be—

- (a) the territory of the state in which the vehicle is registered;
- (b) in cases where no registration is required for the type of vehicle, but the vehicle bears an insurance plate or distinguishing sign analogous to a registration plate, the territory of the state in which the insurance plate or the sign is issued; or
- (c) in cases where a registration plate, insurance plate and distinguishing sign is not required for the type of vehicle, the territory of the state in which the keeper of the vehicle is permanently resident;

and “Communities” in that subsection means the European Economic Community, the

European Coal and Steel Community and the European Atomic Energy Community.”.

2. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Road Traffic (Compulsory Third Party Insurance) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1979. Citation and collective title.

(2) This Ordinance and the principal Ordinance may be cited as the Road Traffic (Compulsory Third Party Insurance) (Guernsey) Ordinances, 1972 and 1979.
