**The Road Traffic (Compulsory Third-Party Insurance) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1962**

THE STATES, on the representations of the States Board of Administration, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Article twelve and Article fourteen of the Road Traffic (Compulsory Third-Party Insurance) (Guernsey) Law, 1936, as amended, hereby order:—

1. The Road Traffic (Compulsory Third-Party Insurance) Ordinance, 1936, as amended (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance") is hereby further amended as follows, that is to say:—

- (a) Regulation one thereof is hereby re-numbered as paragraph (1) of Regulation one and the

following additional paragraph is hereby inserted immediately thereafter—

“(2) Any reference in this Ordinance to any other enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed and replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment including this Ordinance”;

(b) in paragraph (3) of Regulation two thereof the words and figures “The Road Traffic Acts, 1930 to 1934,” are hereby deleted and the words and figures “the Road Traffic Act, 1960,” are hereby substituted therefor;

(c) paragraph (4) of Regulation two thereof is hereby repealed and the following paragraphs (4) and (5) are hereby substituted therefor—

“(4) In any case where it is intended that a certificate of insurance or a covering note shall be effective not only in Guernsey, but also in any of the following territories, that is to say, Great Britain, Northern Ireland, the Isle of Man, the Island of Jersey or the Island of Alderney, Forms A, B and C set out in the Schedule hereto may be modified by the addition thereto, where necessary, of the titles of such statutes or laws of those territories as may be relevant.

(5) A certificate of insurance may contain either on the face of it or on the back of the certificate a statement as to whether or not the policy to which it relates is effective in any of the territories referred to in the last preceding paragraph.”;

(d) paragraph (3) of Regulation five is hereby repealed;

- (e) in Regulation twenty-six thereof the words “Five Pounds” are hereby repealed and the words “twenty pounds” are hereby substituted therefor;
- (f) in the respective headings to Form A, Form B and Form C set out in the Schedule thereto the words and figures—  
     “Guernsey Road Traffic Law, 1936.  
     Certificate of Insurance.”  
 are hereby deleted and the words—  
     “Certificate of Motor Insurance”  
 are hereby substituted therefor;
- (g) Form G set out in the Schedule thereto is hereby repealed.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of the principal Ordinance as amended by this Ordinance in any case where a form of certificate thereby prescribed differs from the corresponding form prescribed by the principal Ordinance immediately before the coming into force of this Ordinance, any form of certificate in the said corresponding form may continue to be issued for the purposes of the principal Ordinance as amended by this Ordinance until the expiration of two years from the date of the coming into force of this Ordinance. Transitional provisions.

3. The Road Traffic (Compulsory Third-Party Insurance) Amendment Ordinance, 1950, is hereby repealed. Repeal.

4. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Road Traffic (Compulsory Third-Party Insurance) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1962. Citation and collective title.

(2) This Ordinance and the principal Ordinance may be cited together as the Road Traffic (Compulsory Third-Party Insurance) Ordinances, 1936 and 1962.

5. This Ordinance shall come into force on the eighth day of February, nineteen hundred and sixty-two.
