**The Road Traffic (Fountain Street
Parking) Ordinance, 1959**

THE STATES, on the representations of the Island Police Committee, hereby order:—

1. (1) A person being in charge of a vehicle shall not, without the permission in writing of the Chief Officer of Police, allow that vehicle to remain in Fountain Street, in the parish of Saint Peter Port, for any continuous period greater than a period of fifteen minutes in any continuous period of sixty minutes during the hours in which the Public Markets are open for business otherwise than for such period as may be reasonably necessary for loading or unloading that vehicle.

(2) In this Ordinance the expression "vehicle" shall have the meaning assigned to it by Article 1 of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au

Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, as amended.

2. Any person who contravenes the provisions of section one of this Ordinance shall be guilty of an offence and liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding five pounds and, on the second and any subsequent conviction, to a fine not exceeding ten pounds.

3. This Ordinance shall come into force on the tenth day of December, nineteen hundred and fifty-nine.
