Ordinance of the States **XXIII**

1962

Made 31st October, 1962.

Coming into Operation .. 5th November, 1962.

The Road Traffic (Parking and Temporary Regulations) Ordinance, 1962

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-seventh day of June, nineteen hundred and sixty-two, and on the representations of the Island Police Committee, hereby order:—

1. (1) Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding subsection, a person being in charge of a vehicle shall not allow that vehicle to remain—

Parking in
Victoria
Road and
Vauvert.

(a) in Victoria Road, Saint Peter Port, otherwise than on the south side thereof;

(b) in Vauvert, Saint Peter Port, otherwise than on the south side thereof.

(2) A person being in charge of a vehicle shall not allow that vehicle to remain as aforesaid in Victoria Road below its junction with Valnord Road for any continuous period greater than a period of fifteen minutes in any continuous period of sixty

minutes otherwise than, in the case of a person being in charge of a motor delivery vehicle, when actually engaged in loading or unloading that vehicle.

No-waiting areas to be designated by yellow lines.

2. A person being in charge of a vehicle shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer of Police, allow that vehicle to remain on a public highway within the limits of, and on the same side as, any section of that public highway delineated by a continuous yellow line, either on the kerb or parallel to, and not more than fifteen inches from, the kerb or the edge of the carriageway, as the case may be, and marked thereon by the Island Police Committee.

Temporary regulations to have effect for six months.

3. In section two of the Traffic Temporary Regulations Ordinance, 1950, the words "two months" are hereby repealed and the words "six months" substituted therefor.

Interpretation.

4. In this Ordinance, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

"motor delivery vehicle" means any vehicle which is designed or constructed for use wholly or mainly for the carriage of goods;

"vehicle" has the meaning assigned to it by Article one of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the second day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, as amended.

Penalty.

5. Any person who contravenes the provisions of section one or section two of this Ordinance shall be guilty of an offence and liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding five pounds and in the case of a second or subsequent conviction, to a fine not exceeding ten pounds.

6. This Ordinance may be cited as the Road Traffic Citation.

7. This Ordinance shall come into force on the fifth day of November, nineteen hundred and sixty-two. ^{Commence-}
