The Road Traffic (Pedestrian Control) Ordinance, 1957

ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS

1. Pedestrian contravening police officer's direction.
2. Definitions.
3. Commencement.

(Made on the 29th May, 1957.)

The Road Traffic (Pedestrian Control) Ordinance, 1957

THE STATES, on the representations of the Island Police Committee, hereby order: –

Pedestrian contravening police officer's direction.

1. (1) Where a police officer in uniform is for the time being engaged in the regulation of vehicular or pedestrian traffic in a roadway, any pedestrian who proceeds across or along a carriageway in contravention of a direction to stop given by the police officer, either to pedestrians or to pedestrians and other traffic shall be guilty of an offence and liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding [level 1 on the uniform scale] or, in the case of a second or subsequent offence, to a fine not exceeding [level 2 on the uniform scale].

(2) ...

(3) A police officer may require any person committing an offence against subsection (1) of this section to give his name and address and if that person fails to do so or gives a name or address which is false in a material particular he shall be guilty of an offence and liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding [level 1 on the uniform scale].

NOTES

In section 1,

the words and figure in square brackets in subsection (1) and subsection (3) were substituted by the Uniform Scale of Fines (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 1989, section 2(2), with effect from 1st July, 1989;¹

subsection (2) was repealed by the Traffic Signs and Traffic Light Signals Ordinance, 1988, section 17(1), Schedule 5, with effect from 1st June 1988.

Definitions.

2. For the purposes of this Ordinance the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them –

"**carriageway**" does not include that part of any roadway which consists of a street refuge,

"**roadway**" means any highway and any other place to which the public have access.

Commencement.

3. This Ordinance shall come into force on the first day of June, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven.
