The Road Traffic (Road Humps) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Law, 1994

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolutions of the 29th day of March, 1990¹ and the 16th day of December, 1993², have approved the following provisions which, subject to the Sanction of Her Most Excellent Majesty in Council, shall have force of law in the Island of Guernsey.

Amendment of 1983 Law.

1. The Road Traffic (Road Humps) (Guernsey) Law, 1983³ is hereby amended as follows:-

- (a) in section 1(5), for the words "Ordinance of the States" is substituted "Order of the Committee published on one occasion in La Gazette Officielle";
- (b) in section 1(6), for the words "Ordinance of the States" in each place where they appear is substituted "Order of the Committee";
- (c) in section 1(8)(a), the words from "by more than five inches" to "either side of the hump" inclusive are deleted and ", nor lower that surface, by more than the dimensions prescribed by Ordinance of the States" is substituted;
- (d) immediately after section 1 there is inserted the following section:-

"Temporary road humps

1A. (1) The Committee may from time to time, where it considers it expedient to do so, and after consultation with the Constables of the relevant parish, construct a temporary road hump in a public highway without the consent of the Public Thoroughfares Committee and without complying with the conditions set out in section 1(3) to (5) hereof but otherwise in accordance with the provisions of this Law.

(2) Subject to subsection (3), a temporary road hump constructed in accordance with subsection (1) shall be removed before the expiration of a period of 49 days from the date of its construction.

(3) The Committee may, after consultation with the Constables of the relevant parish and by a single notice in La Gazette Officielle, extend the period specified in subsection (2) to a period not exceeding an aggregate of 98 days within the twelve months immediately following the date of construction of the hump.

(4) The Committee may from time to time, where it considers it expedient to do so in consequence of an emergency, construct a temporary road hump in a public highway for a maximum period of 7 days without consultation with the Constables or publication of a notice.

(5) A temporary road hump constructed in accordance with this section shall, subject to the provisions thereof, have effect for all purposes as a road hump.";

- (e) in section 2(1), for "Island Police Committee" is substituted "States Traffic Committee".

Citation

2. This Law may be cited as the Road Traffic (Road Humps) (Amendment) (Guernsey) Law, 1994.

Commencement

3. This Law shall come into force on a date to be appointed by Ordinance of the States.
