Ordinance of the States **III**

1968

Made 31st January, 1968

Coming into Operation 1st February, 1968

**The Road Traffic (South Esplanade)
(Clearway) Ordinance, 1968**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-ninth day of November, nineteen hundred and sixty-seven, hereby order:—

1. A person being in charge of a vehicle or an animal shall not, without the permission of the Chief Officer of Police, cause or permit that vehicle or animal to wait on any part of the carriageway of the South Esplanade, Saint Peter Port, to the West of the Bus Terminus between a traffic sign placed as near as may be to the offices of the British European Airways Corporation and a traffic sign placed as near as may be to the Picquet House, otherwise than to permit pedestrians to cross at the pedestrian crossing, on any week day between the hours of—

Waiting prohibited during certain periods.

- (a) twelve noon and one o'clock in the afternoon; and
- (b) five o'clock and six o'clock in the afternoon.

Interpreta-
tion.

2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

“animal” does not include a dog or a cat;

“traffic sign” has the meaning assigned to it by section one of the Vehicular Traffic (Traffic Signs) Ordinance, 1961(a);

“vehicle” means a mechanically propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on a public highway and includes an animal drawn vehicle, a bicycle and a tricycle.

3. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Road Traffic (South Esplanade) (Clearway) Ordinance, 1968.

(2) This Ordinance shall come into force on the first day of February, nineteen hundred and sixty-eight.
