**The Road Traffic (Speed Limits and  
Pedestrian Crossings) (Amendment)  
Ordinance, 1964**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-seventh day of May, nineteen hundred and sixty-four, hereby order:—

1. Subsection (1) of section five of the Road Traffic (Speed Limits and General Provisions) Ordinance, 1955, as amended<sup>(a)</sup>, is hereby repealed and the following subsection is hereby substituted therefor:—

“(1) Subject to the provisions of this section, a person shall not on any public highway drive a motor vehicle exceeding three and a half tons unladen weight at a speed exceeding twenty miles per hour.”

2. Paragraph (a) of Regulation “R<sub>3</sub>” of the Ordinance entitled “Ordonnance ayant rapport au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile” of the thirtieth day of

January, nineteen hundred and thirty-seven(*b*), is hereby repealed and the following paragraph is hereby substituted therefor:—

“(a) For the purposes of this Regulation the expression “Crossing” means a crossing place for pedestrians such crossing place being indicated by two lines of studs placed across the carriageway at a distance, measured from the outside edges of the studs, of not less than eight feet and not more than sixteen feet and the area between those lines marked along the carriageway with a pattern of alternate black and white stripes save that where the colour of the surface of the carriageway provides a reasonable contrast with the colour of the white that surface may itself be utilized for providing those stripes which would otherwise be required to be black.”.

3. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Road Traffic (Speed Limits and Pedestrian Crossings) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1964.

(2) This Ordinance shall come into force on the third day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty-five.
