The Road Traffic (Speed Limits and Trailers) Ordinance, 1959

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolutions of the seventeenth day of December, nineteen hundred and fifty-eight, and of the twenty-eighth day of January, nineteen hundred and fifty-nine, hereby order:—

1. Regulation "G" of the Ordinance entitled "Ordonnance ayant rapport au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile" of the twenty-first day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, is hereby repealed.

2. Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding subsection, a person shall not drive or ride, on any public highway, a motor vehicle to which there is attached a trailer of any of the categories of trailers

set out in the left-hand column of the Schedule to this Ordinance at a speed in excess of the speed specified in the right-hand column of that Schedule in relation to that category.

3. A person shall not, save with the permission of the Chief Officer of the Island Police, drive or ride, on any public highway, a motor vehicle to which there is attached more than one trailer of any category.

4. In paragraph (b) of section three of the Road Traffic (Speed Limits and General Provisions) Ordinance, 1955, as amended, the full stop after the words "King's Mills Road" is hereby deleted and a semi-colon is substituted therefor and immediately thereafter there are hereby inserted the following words—

"Grandes Maisons Road in the parish of Saint Sampson;

New Road in the parish of Saint Sampson."

5. For the purposes of this Ordinance the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:—

"motor vehicle" means a mechanically propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on a public highway;

"trailer" means a vehicle drawn by a motor vehicle.

6. This Ordinance shall come into force on the sixteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and fifty-nine.

SCHEDULE

Category of Trailer	Speed Limit of Motor Vehicle to which Trailer is attached
Steam boilers, tar boilers, concrete mixers, material spreaders and other trailers of any kind whatsoever with metal wheels.	Eight miles per hour.
Four-wheeled heavy trailers of the low loader type.	Twelve miles per hour.
Caravan homes, horse and cattle boxes and two-wheeled trailers of any kind whatsoever.	Twenty miles per hour.
