## **The Rue Marguerite (Closure) (Guernsey) Law, 2001**

**THE STATES**, in pursuance of their resolution of the 27<sup>th</sup> day of December, 2000<sup>a</sup>, have approved the following provisions which, subject to the Sanction of Her Most Excellent Majesty in Council, shall have force of law in the island of Guernsey.

### **Permanent closure of Rue Marguerite.**

1. (1) From the appointed day –
  - (a) the Rue Marguerite shall be closed and shall cease to be a public highway,
  - (b) no person may, except with the consent (express or implied) of the owner, pass and repass over, or be on, the Rue Marguerite, whether on foot or with animals or vehicles, and
  - (c) the Rue Marguerite and the land upon which it runs shall vest for an estate of inheritance in the States of Guernsey.

- (2) In this Law –

**"appointed day"** means the day appointed by order of the States Public Thoroughfares Committee,

**"Rue Marguerite"** means that part of the road called Rue Marguerite in Saint Peter Port which runs between the western end of Le Febvre Street

and St James Street, which is known as New Street North and which is shown on the plan signed for the purposes of this Law by the Bailiff and lodged at the Greffe.

**NOTES**

*The following Order has been made under section 1:*

*Rue Marguerite (Closure) (Appointed Day) Order, 2004.*

*In accordance with the provisions of the Rue Marguerite (Closure) (Appointed Day) Order, 2004, section 1, the appointed day for the purposes of this section shall be the 14th March, 2004.*

*In accordance with the provisions of the Machinery of Government (Transfer of Functions) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 2003, section 2, Schedule 1, paragraph 23, with effect from 6th May, 2004, the Public Thoroughfares Committee was replaced by the Public Services Department; and the functions, rights and liabilities of the Public Thoroughfares Committee and of its President arising under or by virtue of this Law were transferred to and vested in, respectively, the Public Services Department and its Minister by the Machinery of Government (Transfer of Functions) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 2003, section 1, Schedule 1, paragraph 23, with effect from 6th May, 2004, subject to the savings and transitional provisions in section 4 of the 2003 Ordinance. In accordance with the provisions of the Organisation of States' Affairs (Transfer of Functions) Ordinance, 2016, section 2, Schedule 1, paragraph 12(a), with effect from 1st May, 2016, the Public Services Department has since been replaced by the Committee for the Environment & Infrastructure; and the functions, rights and liabilities of the Public Services Department and of its Minister or Deputy Minister arising under or by virtue of this Law were transferred to and vested in, respectively, the Committee for the Environment & Infrastructure and its President or Vice-President by the Organisation of States' Affairs (Transfer of Functions) Ordinance, 2016, section 1, Schedule 1, paragraph 12(a), with effect from 1st May, 2016, subject to the savings and transitional provisions in section 3 of the 2016 Ordinance.*

**Citation.**

2. This Law may be cited as the Rue Marguerite (Closure) (Guernsey) Law, 2001.
