ORDER IN COUNCIL



IN THE ROYAL COURT OF THE ISLAND OF GUERNSEY

The Bailiff having this day placed before the Court an Order of Her Majesty in Council dated the 22nd day of December, 1971, ratifying a *Projet de Loi* entitled "The Social Insurance (Amendment) (No. 3) (Guernsey) Law, 1971", the Court, after the reading of the said Order in Council and after having heard Her Majesty's Comptroller thereon, ordered that the said Order in Council be registered on the records of this Island and that an extract of this present Act, together with a copy of the said Order in Council, be sent by Her Majesty's Greffier to the Clerk of the Court of Alderney for registration on the records of that Island, of which Order in Council the tenor followeth:—

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Report from the Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Council for the Affairs of Guernsey and Jersey, dated the 2nd day of December 1971, in the words following, viz.:—

“YOUR MAJESTY having been pleased, by Your General Order of Reference of the 22nd day of February 1952, to refer unto this Committee the humble Petition of the States of the Island of Guernsey, setting forth:—

1. That, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 28th day of July 1971, the States of Deliberation at a meeting held on the 29th day of September 1971 approved a Bill or “Projet de Loi” entitled “The Social Insurance (Amendment) (No. 3) (Guernsey) Law, 1971” and requested the Bailiff to present a most humble Petition to Your Majesty in Council praying for Your Royal Sanction thereto. 2. That the said Bill or “Projet de Loi” is in the words and figures set forth in the Schedule hereunto

annexed. And most humbly praying that Your Majesty might be graciously pleased to grant Your Royal Sanction to the Bill or "Projet de Loi" of the States of Guernsey entitled "The Social Insurance (Amendment) (No. 3) (Guernsey) Law, 1971" and to order that the same shall have force of law in the Islands of Guernsey, Alderney, Herm and Jethou.'

"THE LORDS OF THE COMMITTEE, in obedience to Your Majesty's said Order of Reference, have taken the said Petition and the said Projet de Loi into consideration, and do this day agree humbly to report, as their opinion, to Your Majesty, that it may be advisable for Your Majesty to comply with the prayer of the said Petition and to approve of and ratify the said Projet de Loi."

HER MAJESTY having taken the said Report into consideration is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of and ratify the said Projet de Loi, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the same shall have the force of Law within the Islands of Guernsey, Alderney, Herm and Jethou.

AND HER MAJESTY doth hereby further direct that this Order, and the said Projet de Loi (a copy whereof is hereunto annexed), be entered upon the Register of the Island of Guernsey and observed accordingly.

AND the Lieutenant Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Island of Guernsey, the Bailiff and Jurats, and all other Her Majesty's Officers for the time being in the said Island, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

PROJET DE LOI

ENTITLED

The Social Insurance (Amendment) (No. 3) (Guernsey) Law, 1971

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-eighth day of July, nineteen hundred and seventy-one, have approved the following provisions which, subject to the Sanction of Her Most Excellent Majesty in Council, shall have force of law in the Islands of Guernsey, Alderney, Herm and Jethou.

1. The provisions of any Ordinance made in pursuance of the provisions of subsection (5) of section nineteen or of subsection (3) of section twenty of the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1964(a), as amended, shall not affect the operation of either of the said subsections as respects contributions paid for contribution weeks commencing before the date of the coming into force of any such Ordinance but any such Ordinance may make transitional provision for cases where the relevant contributions so paid do not make up the number or a multiple of the number of contributions required by the said subsection (5) or the said subsection (3), as the case may be, in order to obtain an increase in the weekly rate of an old age pension (including provision for making up the contributions so paid to a multiple of the said number with the aid of contributions paid for later weeks, or making up the contributions

paid for later weeks to a multiple of the number of contributions required to be paid after the date of the coming into force of any such Ordinance in order to obtain an increase in the weekly rate of an old age pension with the aid of the said contributions).

Amendments to Law of 1971.

2. Paragraph (b) of section three of, section twenty-nine of, and the Second Schedule to, the Social Insurance (Amendment) (Guernsey) Law, 1971 (hereinafter referred to as "the Law of 1971") are hereby repealed.

Repeal.

3. In section thirty-five of the Law of 1971, the comma immediately after the figures "1971" where those figures first occur is hereby deleted and a full-stop is hereby substituted therefor and all the words and figures after those figures to the end of that section are hereby repealed.

Citation and collective title.

4. (1) This Law may be cited as the Social Insurance (Amendment) (No. 3) (Guernsey) Law, 1971.

(2) This Law, the Social Insurance (Amendment) (Guernsey) Law, 1971, the Social Insurance (Amendment) (No. 2) (Guernsey) Law, 1971, and the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Laws, 1964 to 1967, may be cited together as the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Laws, 1964 to 1971.

Commencement.

5. This Law shall be deemed to have come into force on such date as shall be appointed in that behalf by Ordinance of the States of Guernsey.
