**The Social Insurance  
(Increase of Contributions and Benefits and  
Miscellaneous Provisions) (Guernsey)  
Ordinance, 1967**

THE STATES, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by sections two, eleven, sixteen, nineteen, thirty-three, forty-eight and seventy-seven of the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1964, and in pursuance of their Resolution of the twenty-eighth day of September, nineteen hundred and sixty-six, hereby order:—

1. (1) In this Ordinance the expression “the Law of 1964” means the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1964. Interpretation.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in this Ordinance to any enactment or regulations shall be construed as including a reference to that enactment or those regulations, as the case may be, as amended, repealed, replaced

or revoked by or under any other enactment or by any other regulations.

(3) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, shall apply to the interpretation of this Ordinance throughout the Islands of Guernsey, Alderney, Herm and Jethou.

Increase of States' Annual Grant.

2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (3) of section two of the Law of 1964 is hereby repealed and the following paragraph is hereby substituted therefor—

“(b) in addition to the States’ supplement, an annual grant (hereafter in this Law referred to as “the States’ grant”) of—

- (i) four hundred and nine thousand, seven hundred and twenty pounds sterling in respect of the year 1967; and
- (ii) four hundred and thirteen thousand pounds sterling in respect of each year thereafter”.

Amendment of section sixteen of the Law of 1964.

3. Subsection (4) of section sixteen of the Law of 1964 is hereby amended as follows:—

- (a) the words “one hundred and ten shillings” are hereby repealed and the words “one hundred and twenty shillings” are hereby substituted therefor;
- (b) the words “eighty shillings” are hereby repealed and the words “ninety shillings” are hereby substituted therefor;
- (c) the words “one hundred and thirty shillings” are hereby repealed and the words “one hundred and forty-five shillings” are hereby substituted therefor; and
- (d) the words “one hundred shillings” are

hereby repealed and the words "one hundred and ten shillings" are hereby substituted therefor.

4. Subsection (5) of section nineteen of the Law of 1964 is hereby amended as follows:—

Amendment of section nineteen of the Law of 1964.

(a) the words "eighty shillings" are hereby repealed and the words "ninety shillings" are hereby substituted therefor; and

(b) the words "one hundred shillings" are hereby repealed and the words "one hundred and ten shillings" are hereby substituted therefor.

5. Parts I, II, III and IV of the First Schedule to the Law of 1964 are hereby repealed and the Parts I, II, III and IV set out in the First Schedule to this Ordinance are hereby substituted therefor.

Increase of contributions.

6. The Second Schedule to the Law of 1964 is hereby repealed and the Second Schedule set out in the Second Schedule to this Ordinance is hereby substituted therefor.

Increase of benefit.

7. The Fourth Schedule to the Law of 1964 is hereby repealed and the Fourth Schedule set out in the Third Schedule to this Ordinance is hereby substituted therefor.

Increase of industrial disablement benefit.

8. In subsection (2) of section sixteen of the Social Insurance (Determination of Claims and Questions) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1964, immediately after the word "four" there are hereby inserted the words "or of sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (2) of regulation six A".

9. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Social Insurance (Increase of Contributions and Benefits and Miscellaneous Provisions) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1967.

(2) This Ordinance shall have effect in the Islands of Guernsey, Alderney, Herm and Jethou.

(3) This Ordinance shall come into force on the third day of April, nineteen hundred and sixty-seven.
