**The Social Insurance (Increase of
Contributions and Benefits and Misc-
ellaneous Provisions) (Guernsey)
Ordinance, 1976**

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and seventy-six, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by sections two, ten, eleven, nineteen, twenty, thirty-three, thirty-four and seventy-seven of the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1964, as amended^(a), and by section one of the Social Insurance (Amendment) (No. 3) (Guernsey) Law, 1971^(b), and in exercise of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby order:—

1. (1) In this Ordinance, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

“the Law of 1964” means the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1964;

“reckonable contributions” means contributions which are to be taken into account for the purposes of the provisions of subsection (5) of section nineteen of the Law of 1964 (which relates to old age pensions) and of subsection (3) of section twenty of the Law of 1964 (which contains special provisions as to women);

and any other expressions have the same meanings as in the Law of 1964.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in this Ordinance to any other enactment shall be construed as including a reference to that enactment as amended, repealed, replaced, extended or applied by or under any other enactment including this Ordinance.

(3) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948(c), shall apply to the interpretation of this Ordinance throughout the Islands of Guernsey, Alderney, Herm and Jethou.

2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (3) of section two of the Law of 1964 (which relates to the source of funds) is hereby repealed and the following paragraph is hereby substituted therefor—

“(b) in addition to the States’ supplement, an annual grant (hereafter in this Law referred to as “the States’ grant”) of—

(i) two million, one hundred and fifty-two thousand, six hundred and twenty-three pounds in respect of the year nineteen hundred and seventy-six; and

(ii) two million, two hundred and sixty-four thousand pounds in respect of each year thereafter.”

3. In subsection (1) of section ten of the Law of 1964 (which relates to widows who are employed persons), the words “eight new pence” are hereby repealed and the words “nine new pence” are hereby substituted therefor.

4. In subsection (5) of section nineteen of the Law of 1964 (which relates to old age pensions), the words “twenty-six new pence” are hereby repealed and the words “thirty new pence” are hereby substituted therefor.

5. In subsection (3) of section twenty of the Law of 1964 (which contains special provisions as to women), the words “thirteen new pence”, wherever they occur, are hereby repealed and the words “fifteen new pence” are hereby substituted therefor.

Amendment of section twenty of the Law of 1964.

6. For the purposes of the said subsection (5) of section nineteen and the said subsection (3) of section twenty of the Law of 1964, any reckonable contributions paid for contribution week before the seventh day of June, nineteen hundred and seventy-six, and which do not on that day make up nine (or a multiple of nine) contributions, shall be treated as if they had been paid for contribution weeks commencing on or after that date.

Treatment of reckonable contributions.

7. In section thirty-four of the Law of 1964 (which relates to adjustments for successive accidents), the words “twelve pounds” are hereby repealed and the words “thirteen pounds and fifty new pence” are hereby substituted therefor.

8. Parts I, II, III and IV of the First Schedule to the Law of 1964 (which relates to contribution rates) are hereby repealed and Parts I, II, III and IV set out in the First Schedule to this Ordinance are hereby substituted therefor.

9. The Second Schedule to the Law of 1964 (which relates to the rate or amount of benefit) is hereby repealed and the Schedule set out in the Second Schedule to this Ordinance is hereby substituted therefor.

10. The Fourth Schedule to the Law of 1964 (which relates to the rates of industrial disablement benefit) is hereby repealed and the Schedule set out in the Third Schedule to this Ordinance is hereby substituted therefor.

Repeal.

11. The Social Insurance (Increase of Contributions and Benefits and Miscellaneous Provisions) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1975(d), excluding section one, section three, section seven, section twelve and section fourteen thereof and the Fourth Schedule thereto, is hereby repealed.

12. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Social Insurance (Increase of Contributions and Benefits and Miscellaneous Provisions) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1976.

(2) This Ordinance shall have effect in the Islands of Guernsey, Alderney, Herm and Jethou.

(3) This Ordinance shall come into force on the seventh day of June, nineteen hundred and seventy-six.

For the purpose of this Part of this Schedule a person over pensionable age, not being an insured person, shall be treated as an employed person if he would be an insured person were he under pensionable age and would be an employed person were he an insured person.
