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**The Social Insurance**  
**(Limited Medical Benefit) (Guernsey)**  
**Ordinance, 1966**

THE STATES, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section fifteen of the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1964(a), as amended by the Social Insurance (Amendment) (Guernsey) Law, 1965(b), and of all other powers thereunto them enabling, hereby order:—

1. (1) In this Ordinance, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

“the determining authority” means the Administrator or the tribunal, as the case may require;

“insured person” means an insured person to whom the provisions of section fifteen of the Law apply;

“the Law” means the Social Insurance (Guernsey) Law, 1964;

“the Limited Medical Benefit Account” means the subsidiary account of the Guernsey Insurance Fund established for the purpose of administering so much of the Law as relates to limited medical benefit;

“week” means a contribution week;  
and any other expressions have the same meanings as in the Law.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in this Ordinance to any enactment or regulations shall be construed as including a reference to that enactment or those regulations, as the case may be, as amended, repealed, replaced or revoked by or under any other enactment or by any other regulations.

(3) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948, shall apply to the interpretation of this Ordinance throughout the Islands of Guernsey, Alderney, Herm and Jethou.

2. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance and of any Ordinance and any regulations made under the Law, an insured person—

- (a) who suffers personal injury caused by accident otherwise than by accident arising out of and in the course of his employment;  
or

- (b) who is treated as a non-employed person in accordance with the provisions of any regulations made in pursuance of the provisions of the Law and who suffers personal injury caused by accident arising out of or in the course of his employment;

shall be entitled to limited medical benefit.

(2) An insured person shall not be entitled to limited medical benefit in respect of a personal injury unless he satisfies one of the following conditions, namely, that in the week immediately preceding the week in which he sustains the said injury—

- (a) he was liable to pay a contribution as respects limited medical benefit in respect of that week and that such contribution was paid in that week; or
- (b) he was entitled to be credited with a contribution in respect of that week by reason of incapacity for work or unemployment, as the case may be.

(3) The conditions contained in the last preceding subsection shall be deemed to be satisfied in respect of personal injury sustained by an insured person during the period commencing on the day in the week in which he first became insured under the Law and ending on the last day in that week.

(4) The provisions of paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of this section shall be deemed to be satisfied in the case of an employed person who sustains personal injury and whose employer was not, by virtue of the provisions of regulation six of the Social Insurance (Collection of Contributions) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1964, liable in, and in respect of, the week immediately preceding the week in which such em-

ployed person sustained the said injury to pay a contribution in respect of or on behalf of that employed person.

Disqualifica-

3. (1) Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding subsection, an insured person shall be disqualified for receiving a grant in respect of limited medical benefit if—

- (a) the personal injury in respect of which he has claimed such benefit is due to his own misconduct; or
- (b) he fails without good cause, on receipt of not less than three clear days notice in writing given by the Authority requiring him so to do, to attend for, or to submit himself to, medical or other examination at such place and at such time (of which two clear days notice shall be given) as may be subsequently communicated to him; or
- (c) he fails without good cause to attend for, or to submit himself to, medical or other treatment:

Provided that this disqualification shall not apply to any failure to submit to a surgical operation, unless the failure is a failure to submit to a surgical operation of a minor character, and is considered by the determining authority to be unreasonable; or

- (d) he fails, without good cause, to refrain from behaviour calculated to retard his recovery and to answer any reasonable enquiries (not being enquiries relating to medical examination, treatment or advice) by the Authority or its officers directed to ascertaining whether he is doing so.

(2) A decision of the determining authority under subsection (1) of this section disqualifying an insured person for receiving a grant in respect of limited medical benefit shall not apply in relation to any liability incurred in respect of that person before the date on which that decision was made.

4. (1) Contributions as respects limited medical benefit shall be paid into the Limited Medical Benefit Account.

(2) Grants in respect of limited medical benefit shall be payable only out of the amount for the time being standing to the credit of the Limited Medical Benefit Account.

(3) The expenses, as determined by the Authority from time to time, incurred in connection with the administration of so much of the Law as relates to limited medical benefit shall be charged to the Limited Medical Benefit Account.

5. (1) The Authority may provide grants in respect of limited medical benefit of such amount or of such nature as the Authority may in its absolute discretion determine:

Provided that the means of any person shall not be taken into consideration in determining the amount of such grant.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of the Social Insurance (Claims and Payments) (Guernsey) Regulations, 1964, a grant in respect of limited medical benefit shall be paid to such person as the Authority may determine.

6. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Social Insurance (Limited Medical Benefit) (Guernsey) Ordinance, 1966.

(2) This Ordinance shall have effect in the Islands of Guernsey, Alderney, Herm and Jethou.
