The Vehicular Traffic Ordinance, 1952.

THE STATES, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 19th day of March, 1952, and on the representations of the Island Police Committee, hereby order:—

1. Article five of the Ordonnance relative au Trafic Véhiculaire en cette Ile of the 2nd day of March, 1929 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance") is repealed and the following Article substituted therefor:—

"Article V

(1) If any person drives a vehicle or horse or other animal on a public highway recklessly, or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, including the nature, condition, and use of that highway, and the amount of traffic which is

actually at the time, or which might reasonably be expected to be, on that highway, he shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding four months, and in the case of a second or subsequent conviction either to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to such imprisonment as aforesaid or to both such fine and imprisonment ;

(2) If any person drives a vehicle or horse or other animal on a public highway without due care and attention or without reasonable consideration for other persons using that highway he shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding ten pounds and in the case of a second or subsequent conviction, to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds."

2. Article three of the principal Ordinance is repealed.

3. The principal Ordinance may be cited as the Vehicular Traffic Ordinance, 1929, and the principal Ordinance and this Ordinance may be cited together as the Vehicular Traffic Ordinances 1929 and 1952.

4. This Ordinance shall come into force on the 21st day of April, 1952.
